## FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

The gates of hell shall not prevail against her.

Winston Churchill refuted those who claimed that the British had "almost lost" the Battle of Britain. No, he said. If a heavy truck is crossing an old bridge, the onlookers may fear that the bridge will collapse under the load, but once the truck has safely crossed, they cannot say that the bridge 'almost collapsed"; rather, the bridge has demonstrated its strength and their fears have been proven unfounded.

The same logic applies to the Holy Catholic Church. Cardinal Newman, looking at the Church in his day, wrote:

The whole course of Christianity from first to last is but one series of troubles and disorders. Every century is like every other; and to those who live in it seems worse than all times before it. The Church is ever ailing, and lingers on in weakness, "always carrying in the body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be manifested in her body" (2 Cor 4:10). Religion seems ever expiring, schisms dominant, the light of Truth dim, its adherents scattered. The cause of Christ is ever in its last agony, as though it were but a question of time whether it fails finally this day or another.

One hundred and eighty years after Newman wrote those words, the truth of them has not diminished. In Newman's day the Church in almost every part of Europe was under assault by zealous anti-religious governments. Looking back, we can see that it was an age of Saints. Those living through the events, however, were keenly aware of the great peril, and they worried that the Church might collapse under the strain.

Pope Leo XIII wrote in the jubilee year of 1900, with notable understatement: "The outlook on the future is by no means free of anxiety." In the intervening century the Church has survived innumerable crises, but there appears no end of new ones. Today, in many parts of the world Christians are actively persecuted. In China the Catholic Church survives underground because the Communist government insists on complete control of all institutions. In Europe, where the Church has never been more free and independent, the actual number of Christians has dwindled to almost nothing. The Christian faith there is nearly extinct.

The situation may appear hopeless, but as G. K. Chesterton wrote: "For practical purposes it is at the hopeless moment that we require the hopeful man, and the virtue either does not exist at all, or begins to exist at that moment. Exactly at the instant when hope ceases to be reasonable it begins to be useful."

Jesus promised that the gates of hell would not prevail against his Church, and that promise has been tested time and time again in the course of two millennia. Jesus, did not promise that we would be free of troubles. On the contrary, he said: "I have said these things to you, that in me you may have peace. In the world you have tribulation; but be of good cheer, I have overcome the world."
