## FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

This will be a sign for you, that I have sent you.

In the book of Exodus, Moses asks God for a sign. God tells him: "This shall be the sign for you, that I have sent you: when you have brought forth the people out of Egypt, you shall serve me upon this mountain." When I first read that I thought that it was a strange kind of sign — one that can be verified only *after the fact*! Then there came a time in my own life when I felt strongly that God was calling me to serve Him as a priest, but I could see no possible way of bringing that about. It was a case of "You can't get there from here." And I remembered Moses' sign. The proof that God was calling me would be that, in spite of all the obstacles, He would make it happen.

The decision to apply to the Seminary was not an easy one to make. It meant leaving a professional career that I loved and leaving a parish community that was nurturing my faith; it meant a complete change of life. Was this really what God was calling me to do? I had to go on trust. At the end of my first day in the Seminary, I was alone at night in the Chapel, and I recalled those words: "This shall be the sign for you: you shall serve me upon this mountain."

In the middle year of their studies Seminarians do a pastoral internship in a parish. I did my internship here at St. Paul's with Fr. Tad Walczyk in 2005-6. It was a good sign that this parish is dedicated to St. Paul the Apostle, a favorite Saint. That the parish had a second Church dedicated to the Immaculate Conception was a huge bonus.

When I was ordained as a transitional Deacon in 2007, Cardinal Collins had recently been appointed as Archbishop of Toronto Diocese, and he decided that the Deacons should be ordained in their home parishes. I chose to be ordained here at St. Paul's. The day assigned for my ordination was 9 December 2007, the day after the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception.

My good friend Laura often joked with me about my coming back to this parish as a priest. But things like that just do not happen. Then in the spring of 2011, the head of priest personnel informed me that the plan to assign me a parish had fallen through and that I would be sent to help out at St. Mary's in Barrie. In September of that year, Fr. Keith Wallace had to leave Holy Spirit Parish in Barrie for personal reasons, and Fr. Tad agreed to take over from him, leaving St. Paul's without a pastor. I got the phone call: would I mind going to Alliston? No, I would not mind at all. And so I came home. After serving for one year as an Administrator, my official installation as Pastor occurred on 9 December 2012, exactly five years from the day of my Deacon ordination in this same Church.

When Jesus called his first disciples he said: "Follow me and I will make you fishers of men." And immediately they left their nets and followed him. They had no idea where he was leading them, but they followed in faith. They never regretted their decision.

## Every Year during Advent, we collect for the Chalice Christmas Smiles Campaign:

In the past, we have raised between \$200 -\$400 to give a healthy meal to children in developing countries. Parishes place a metal container in front of the altar. At Offertory time, we invite the children to come forward and drop coins in the tin.
