#### FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

As we prepare to celebrate the coming of the Lord.

Today we continue the season of Advent — the four Sundays leading up to Christmas. We are not yet celebrating Christmas, but rather preparing for the celebration which will begin with evening Mass on December 24<sup>th</sup> then continue throughout the "twelve days of Christmas" until the feast of Epiphany.

Saint Anselm wrote a famous treatise entitled *Cur Deus Homo* — *Why Did God Become Man*. It's a good question and the answer is not obvious. You see, God did not *have to* become man; rather he *chose to* become man. And that is the central mystery of our Christian faith. The big *Why*.

And the only answer is *love*. "For God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten son." It is an answer that leads to another question: Why does God love us? And for that question there is no real answer, because it touches on the very nature of God: God *is* love.

In this season of Advent we start again to recount the story of that incredible love. The typical Hollywood story is "Boy meets girl; boy loses girl, boy regains girl." The story of mankind is similar. Man meets God — creation, the garden of Eden. Man loses God — that regrettable incident with the serpent and its consequences. Man regains God — the incarnation of God as man, born to a virgin in a stable in Bethlehem and laid in a manger.

Of course a good story should have a redemptive ending as well. And ours ends with the ultimate act of love: the sacrificial death of Jesus on the cross.

The early Church fathers did not overlook the symbolism of the lowly manger. A manger is a feeding trough for animals, but it can be seen as a symbol of the altar on which the body of the sacrificial victim is laid, as later Jesus' body would be laid on the altar of the cross. Jesus is born in the shadow of the cross: "For this I was born, for this I came into the world."

In Advent we relive those long ages of longing during which man had lost God. The Messiah has been promised — when will he come? And we recall the word of the prophet Habakkuk: "For still the vision awaits its time; it will hasten to the end — it will not lie. If it seems slow, wait for it. It will surely come. It will not delay."

In Advent we prepare our hearts to welcome the coming of our Savior. There is a threefold coming: past, present and future. The past coming is Jesus' birth in Bethlehem. The future coming will be Christ's coming in glory. The present coming is the coming of Christ here and now into our own hearts. In the opening prayer of today's Mass we ask God for "the resolve to run forth to meet your Christ."

This Advent let us truly prepare to welcome Christ into our hearts and into our homes. As St. Augustine says: "The entire life of a good Christian is in fact an exercise of holy longing. So, my brethren, let us expand our hearts. Let us continue to desire, for then we shall be filled."
