

FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

How can I keep from singing?

Can we imagine Christmas without music? The "sounds of the season" prepare our hearts to welcome the birth of Jesus, an event which occurred long ago in the silence of God, but which is now loudly proclaimed.

Throughout the Advent and Christmas seasons, the Roman Catholic Church keeps up the venerable tradition of singing the Latin hymn *Alma Redemptoris Mater*:

O loving Mother of our Redeemer, gate of heaven, star of the sea, hasten to aid thy fallen people who strive to rise once more. You who brought forth your holy Creator, all creation wondering, yet remaining ever Virgin, taking from Gabriel's lips that joyful "Hail!": be merciful to us sinners.

This beautiful hymn was composed in the 11th century by a monk named Hermann the Cripple. Born severely disabled, his parents placed him in the care of the monks of Reichenau Abbey. Hermann proved to be a brilliant scholar, mastering Latin, Greek and Arabic, and writing books on history, mathematics and astronomy. He died at the age of forty-one and is now remembered for his hymns, among which is also the *Salve Regina*, which we know as the prayer "Hail Holy Queen," prayed at the end of the Rosary.

St. Augustine, contemplating the incarnation and birth of Jesus, says: He who existed before all ages now enters the course of years. The Son of God chooses to become the Son of Man. He takes on the fullness of our human nature so that the "king of the universe" might be subject to human parents; that the "bread of life" might be hungry; that the "fountain" might thirst; that he who is the "way" might be wearied by the journey; that he who is "truth" might be condemned by lying witnesses. He submits to evil for our sake without our having done anything to deserve it. The eternally begotten of the Father is made man in the womb of a virgin Mother whom he himself had made. In order that he might exist here for a while, he is born of her who could never have existed except through his power.

A thousand Christmases ago in a cold German monastery, a middle-aged monk crippled from birth and now blind, confined to his bed and in constant pain, also contemplates the birth of Christ. His heart is so filled with wonder and joy that he has to express it in song.

St. Paul wrote to the Colossians: "Be thankful... With gratitude in your hearts, sing psalms, hymns and spiritual songs to God. And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him." We might think that a man whose nickname is "the cripple" has little enough to be thankful for, but Hermann sings out his gratitude, and leaves the world a musical treasure.

As another old-time hymn says: "The peace of Christ makes fresh my heart, a fountain ever springing; all things are mine since I am his — how can I keep from singing?"
