FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

The necessity of prayer.

The Christian vocation is simple: you are first a child of God, and the state of life where God has placed you is the source of your holiness. — Mother Angelica

Several years ago, I was giving a talk to a group of young adults on the Christian understanding of vocation not just vocation to religious life, but vocation to marriage and family as well. I mentioned that before my ordination I had traveled to New York for a week-long prayer retreat with Fr. Benedict Groeschel. By contrast, the fiancé a friend's daughter had traveled to Los Vegas with his buddies for a week-long bachelor party. I asked: Rather than sowing the last of his wild oats, would it not have been better for him to have spent that week praying for his bride and asking for God's blessing on his upcoming marriage? The response was *outrage*! What do you mean? We are not monks or nuns! No, but you are supposed to be Christian men and women. Is it really so outrageous to pray for God's grace in your lives?

Pope John Paul II warned us of a temptation that affects all of us: "thinking that results depend on our ability to act and to plan."

But it is fatal to forget that 'without Christ we can do nothing.' It is prayer which roots us in this truth. It constantly reminds us of the primacy of Christ and, in union with him, the primacy of the interior life and of holiness. When this principle is not respected, is it any wonder that our plans come to nothing and leave us with a disheartening sense of frustration?

Are the demands of our vocation so easy that we can fulfill them without the help of God's grace? In the Sacrament of Matrimony the bride and groom exchange solemn vows: "I promise to be faithful to you, in good times and in bad, in sickness and in health, to love you and honor you all the days my life." This is a promise that many find difficult to keep.

But as St. Augustine says:

God does not demand the impossible; rather, when He commands, He encourages us to do what we can and to ask for what we cannot do. God gives us the help of his grace so that the command becomes possible, since He will never abandon us unless we abandon Him first.

The necessity of divine grace points to the necessity of prayer, *especially when we are busy*! As St. John of the Cross says: "Without prayer we may do a great deal of hammering but we will accomplish little, and sometimes nothing, and at times even cause harm."

At the beginning of this new year, with the example of the Blessed Virgin Mary and St. Joseph before us, let us pray to God for his grace in our lives, so that our vocations may be for us our source of holiness.
