### FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Do not be afraid! Open wide the doors to Christ.

Leaving is easy; coming back is hard. Like most of my generation, I quietly dropped out of the Catholic Church in my teenage years. One of the major obstacles to my reconversion was the perception that the Church of the 1990's was little different from the failing mainline Protestant denominations. What had happened to the Church of St. Augustine? Where was the Church of St. Teresa of Avila? Returning to the Church, I felt like a weary traveler finally come home after a long journey only to find the old farmstead gone, replaced by a cheap modern bungalow.

I was not fully aware of it at the time, but the Church was going through a period of renewal. There was a resurgence of Catholic publishing, and something new: a television network started by a cloistered nun with more faith than sense — EWTN. (If you have not read *Mother Angelica: The Remarkable Story of a Nun, Her Nerve and a Network of Miracles* by Raymond Arroyo, read it!) A fresh wind was blowing through the Church.

One of the key events which occurred at that time was the publication of the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*. Here was the faith — firmly rooted in Scripture and Sacred Tradition. Pope John Paul II declared it "a sure norm for teaching the faith."

More than anything else, it was the example of Pope John Paul II that encouraged me to rediscover my faith and eventually to discern God's call to the priesthood Throughout a long debilitating illness Pope John Paul continued to preach by his example even when he could no longer preach by his words.

I was in the Seminary when Pope John Paul finally succumbed to his illness and another holy priest, Cardinal Ratzinger, was elected as his successor to continue the work of reform. Pope Benedict XVI, in the homily for his first Mass as Pope, recalled the words of his predecessor:

At this point, my mind goes back to 22 October 1978, when Pope John Paul II began his ministry here in Saint Peter's Square. His words on that occasion constantly echo in my ears: "Do not be afraid! Open wide the doors to Christ!"

Are we not perhaps all afraid in some way? If we let Christ enter fully into our lives, if we open ourselves totally to him, are we not afraid that He might take something away from us? No! Only in this friendship are the doors of life opened wide. Only in this friendship is the great potential of human existence truly revealed. Only in this friendship do we experience beauty and liberation.

Do not be afraid of Christ! He takes nothing away, and he gives you everything. When we give ourselves to him, we receive a hundredfold in return. 
