# FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

*Lent* — *a time for conversion.* 

When we first hosted the *Life in the Spirit Seminar*, I admit that I had some issues with the idea of "Baptism in the Spirit." After all, when we were baptized (usually, as infants) we received the Holy Spirit. No further "baptism in the spirit" is necessary or even possible. The lit candle that was given to us at our Baptism was a symbol of the Holy Spirit. We were told: "Keep the flame of faith alive in your heart." Yet, sadly, so many of us have let that flame flicker out. In a sense, we have kept the power of the Spirit tightly sealed in a box. We need to open the box and let the Spirit out. You can call this "baptism in the spirit" or you can call it "conversion." We think of "conversion" as a change of religion. True conversion is a change of heart.

A flame needs oxygen to continue burning. The soul, in the same way, needs the continual breath, the inspiration, of the Holy Spirit. As St. Augustine pointed out:

If the air of this world is withdrawn, the body dies there can be no question of it. And if the Holy Spirit is withdrawn, the soul dies — and there can be even less of a question of that. For once God has given his life to a soul, He has to continuously sustain it thereafter, otherwise it will only die to Him again. So, as long as we remain converted to Him, he promises us this eternal life-sustaining action.

The "baptism in the spirit" is not a new sacrament. It is simply giving permission to the Holy Spirit to once again be the life of our souls. There is a prayer that we all should be able to say:

My God, show me the obstacles that I place in the way of the working of your grace in my soul. Give me the strength to remove them, and, if I am negligent in doing so, remove them for me, even though I should suffer greatly thereby. Grant that my life here on earth may be like eternal life begun.

The great grace of Lent is the grace of conversion. It is during these next forty days that we work at removing the obstacles that we put in the way of God's grace in our lives. Once again, we open our hearts to the Holy Spirit and ask him to be the life of our souls. For, as the soul gives life to the body, so the Holy Spirit gives life to the soul, and we are only truly alive when we are alive in the Holy Spirit. We ought to desire above all things this life of the Holy Spirit.

St. Augustine taught that "the entire life of a good Christian is in fact an exercise of holy desire. By desiring heaven we exercise the powers of our soul. So, my brethren, let us expand our hearts. Let us continue to desire, for then we shall be filled."

This holy season of Lent gives us so many opportunities to re-awaken the life of the Holy Spirit in our souls. Let us expand our hearts and ask God for the grace of conversion.
