FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

The power of silence.

One of the best books of recent years is Cardinal Robert Sarah's autobiography, *God or Nothing*. Sarah was born in 1945 in a poor village in Guinea, West Africa. At the age of twelve, he answered God's call to study for the priesthood. A gifted student, he was later sent to continue his studies in France, Rome and Jerusalem. He was appointed Archbishop of Conakry, Guinea in 1979 at the age of thirty-four, at the time when the country was under an oppressive Marxist dictatorship. In 2001, Pope John Paul II called him to work in Rome. He was made a Cardinal by Pope Benedict and Pope Francis appointed him head of the Congregation for Divine Worship, one of the top posts in the Vatican.

Last year, Cardinal Sarah published a second book, *The Power of Silence: Against the Dictatorship of Noise*. In this book Cardinal Sarah, as one reviewer says, "offers a richly engaging, elegantly written reflection on the importance of recovering silence in our own lives, and through silence, rediscovering the presence of God, the beauty of creation, and the nature of our mission as disciples."

After reading this book, Pope Benedict felt compelled to offer his own praise:

Cardinal Sarah is a spiritual teacher, who speaks out of the depths of silence with the Lord, out of his interior union with him, and thus really has something to say to each one of us. Cardinal Sarah teaches us silence — being silent with Jesus, true inner stillness, and in just this way he helps us to grasp the word of the Lord anew.

We should be grateful to Pope Francis for appointing such a spiritual teacher as head of the congregation that is responsible for the celebration of the liturgy in the Church. With the liturgy, too, as with the interpretation of Sacred Scripture, it is true that specialized knowledge is necessary. But it is also true of the liturgy that specialization ultimately can talk right past the essential thing unless it is grounded in a deep, interior union with the praying Church, which over and over again learns anew from the Lord himself what adoration is. With Cardinal Sarah, a master of silence and of interior prayer, the liturgy is in good hands.

Honestly, I knew nothing about Cardinal Sarah before reading *God or Nothing*. Since then I have been following him closely, and have been consistently impressed by his talks and writings. He is certainly not a *charismatic* speaker, but everything he says comes from a deep well of learning and devotion. He is a man who loves the Lord.

It was my hope to one day meet Cardinal Sarah in person. So it has come as a pleasant surprise to learn that Cardinal Collins has invited him to give a Lenten day-retreat for all priests of the Archdiocese of Toronto, to take place this coming week.
