#### FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

The source and summit of the Christian life.

Last Tuesday, I attended a Day of Recollection for priests of the Archdiocese of Toronto with Cardinal Robert Sarah, head of the Congregation for Divine Worship, and our Archbishop, Cardinal Collins. I was thrilled to finally meet Cardinal Sarah in person, having come to know and admire him through his books.

The day centered around a Holy Hour of Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. As we began singing the *O Salutaris Hostia*, I turned around to look for the amazing choir that was leading us. There wasn't one. I had forgotten what it sounds like when a Church full of people is singing. It was immensely uplifting.

As one might expect, Cardinal Sarah's talk focused on the importance of the liturgy, particularly the need for the reverent celebration of the Mass. He challenged us priests to make the Mass the true center of our lives and of our priestly ministry. Acknowledging the many things that keep the typical Pastor busy throughout the week, he reminded us that the Eucharist is "the source and summit of the Christian life." The Sacred Liturgy is "the summit toward which the activity of the Church is directed; at the same time it is the font from which all her power flows." This is true not only for the Church as a whole, but for each of us individually as well. It is the Eucharist that sustains us in all that we do. It is the Eucharist that makes all our other work fruitful.

Cardinal Sarah offered some "modest proposals" — not as orders coming from the head of the Congregation for Divine Worship, but as earnest appeals from Robert Sarah, a fellow priest and bishop. One of these proposals, which I take very much to heart, is to foster an atmosphere of quiet recollection as we prepare to celebrate the Mass. The Cardinal especially pointed out how there is often a lack of a spirit of recollection before Mass in the *sacristy*!

"Dear Pastors," he said, "make your sacristies places of silence and prayer. Say that Cardinal Sarah told you to do it — I will take the blame."

The Cardinal told us to remember that we, as Pastors, are responsible for the way that Mass is celebrated in our parishes. This means that we must be knowledgeable with regard to the liturgy, and also able to instruct our parishioners. This is not about the Pastor imposing his own peculiar whims on the parish. It is about bringing our celebration into line with the *mens ecclesiae*, the mind of the Church, as clearly expressed in the Instruction on the Roman Missal and the other liturgical documents issued by the Church.

It is said that a presentation can have various purposes: to entertain; to inform; to persuade; to motivate. Cardinal Sarah's purpose was clearly to motivate. He asked us, the priests of this Archdiocese, to "search our souls." Are we really giving our best to the most important aspect of our ministry, the celebration of the Eucharist?


