FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

The Octave of Easter — Divine Mercy Sunday

Mother Angelica died two years ago on Easter Sunday. Raymond Arroyo, the host of EWTN's *The World Over*, presented a wonderful tribute to her on March 29th. If you have access to the internet, it is a 'must see.' It highlights her remarkable sense of humor and her profound wisdom. What a great gift she was to the Catholic Church! Once, when asked how a cloistered nun managed to build the world's largest religious media network, she replied: "Unless you are willing to do the ridiculous, God will not do the miraculous. When you have God, you don't have to know everything about it. You just do it."

The *Eternal Word Television Network* (EWTN) went on the air in 1981, three years into the pontificate of John Paul II. While the Pope built up the faith through his preaching and travels and in a series of landmark Encyclicals, Mother Angelica brought that faith into millions of homes via her television and radio broadcasts. Mother Angelica had no qualms about tackling the so-called theological "experts" she knew her Bible, she knew her Catechism and she loved the Lord. In 1985, Pope John Paul II said that "EWTN is the key to restoring the Roman Catholic Church in America."

Mother Angelica made no secret of her aversion to "liberal" or "progressive" religion. The attempt to make the faith relevant and up-to-date dooms it in short order to become irrelevant and out-of-date. "In the morning it springs up new, but by evening it is dry and withered." The biblical image of faithfulness is the "tree planted by the water that sends out its roots by the stream. It does not fear when heat comes; its leaves are always green. It has no worries in a year of drought and never fails to bear fruit."

Mother Angelica planted satellite dishes rather than trees, and her work continues to bear fruit. Her voice was silenced by a stroke in 2001, but EWTN is still going strong. The work of "restoring the Roman Catholic Church in America" is still a work in progress, and the challenges that we are facing are growing ever more daunting. Relative to an increasingly "progressive" secular culture, we are running up the down escalator.

We cannot gloss over the present state of confusion in the Church — the infidelity which extends even to some of the highest echelons — but there are also many faithful shepherds, like Cardinal Robert Sarah and our own Cardinal Thomas Collins. At the end of the day, truth will prevail.

The progressive theologians who were all the rage in the 1970's and 80's are now long past their "best by" date. The true "Doctors of the Church" — St. Athanasius, St. Augustine, St. Bernard of Clairvaux, St. Thomas Aquinas, St. Teresa of Avila, etc. — they never go out of date.

In "the darkness of this present age," on this Divine Mercy Sunday, we thank God for raising up beacons of the faith like Mother Angelica. "The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it."
