
St. Paul the Apostle and Immaculate Conception Churches

FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Mother's Day.

The month of May is dedicated to Jesus' mother Mary, the perfect model of motherhood. When I picture the home of Joseph and Mary in Nazareth, I see it as a hub of constant activity. Every child in the village would have been drawn to Mary because she loved each of them as if they were her own, and, in a way, they were. If you have met any of the Sisters of Life, you have felt how they radiate this same kind of motherly love. We can hardly imagine the ardent love that radiates from the immaculate heart of Mary for all of us, her children.

Pope Leo XIII, the great Pope of the late 19th century, wrote of Mary's motherhood:

While nature itself made the name of mother the sweetest of all names and has made motherhood the very model of tender and solicitous love, no tongue is eloquent enough to put into words what every devout soul feels, namely how intense is the flame of affectionate and active charity which glows in Mary, in her who is truly our mother not in a human way but through Christ. Nobody knows and comprehends so well as she everything that concerns us: what helps we need in life; what dangers, public or private, threaten our welfare; what difficulties and evils surround us; above all, how fierce is the fight we wage with ruthless enemies of our salvation. In these and in all other troubles of life her power is most far-reaching. Her desire to use it is most ardent to bring consolation, strength, and help of every kind to children who are dear to her.

Accordingly, let us approach Mary confidently, wholeheartedly beseeching her by the bonds of her motherhood which unite her so closely to Jesus and at the same time to us. Let us with deepest devotion invoke her constant aid in prayer which she herself has indicated and which is most acceptable to her. Then with good reason shall we rest with an easy and joyous mind under the protection of the best of mothers.

Pope John Paul II, following Pope Leo by a century, has also written often and eloquently of Mary. The motto on his papal coat of arms is '*Totus tuus*" — "[I am] all yours" — expressing his devotion to Mary. Every single Pope since Leo, especially Pope John Paul II, has strongly encouraged all the faithful to develop a pure and ardent devotion to the Blessed Virgin. Pope Francis recently declared the first Monday after Pentecost the feast day of *Mary, Mother of the Church*.

If we are to advance in our spiritual journey, we must pray. The most beautiful and efficacious prayer, after the Sacrifice of the Mass, is the Rosary. The Rosary was made popular by St. Dominic in the 12th century and has since been the most revered form of Christian prayer. There is no better way to honor Mary our mother on Mother's Day.
