
St. Paul the Apostle and Immaculate Conception Churches

FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Then unity of the Church in the Holy Spirit.

Last Sunday, in my homily, I stated that Pentecost happened two thousand years ago, when the Apostles were suddenly filled with the Holy Spirit. Really, I should have said not that Pentecost *happened*, but that Pentecost *began*. Since then every day has been a continuing Pentecost: the Holy Spirit has never ceased to fill the hearts of the faithful. As St. Augustine said, "The Holy Spirit does in the whole Church what the soul does in all the parts of the body."

Eight years ago, on the feast of Pentecost, Pope Benedict also gave a homily. He said that, with the coming of the Holy Spirit, "God now breathes with untold energy the divine breath upon humanity."

And what does this new and powerful self-communication of God produce? Where there are divisions and estrangement he creates unity and understanding. From the very beginning, from the day of Pentecost, the Church speaks all languages. The Church never remains a prisoner within political, racial and cultural confines because her unity is of a different type and aspires to transcend every human frontier.

From this there derives a practical criterion of discernment for Christian life: When a person or a community limits itself to its own way of thinking and acting, it is a sign that it has distanced itself from the Holy Spirit. The Church responds to her vocation to be a sign and instrument of unity only if she remains free from every state and every particular culture. Always and in every place the Church must truly be catholic and universal, the house of all in which each one can find a place.

Pope Benedict, in this teaching, is addressing a grave problem in the Church. A single Diocese or a single National Conference of Bishops *cannot* go its own way with respect to the teachings of the Gospel. The Catholic faith in Argentina or in Germany cannot be different from the Catholic faith in Canada.

Cardinal Sarah affirmed this same truth when he was asked about the 'African' Church:

The Church in Africa is part of the Universal Church and thus forms together with it a sole and single Church. Hence there is no such thing as an 'African Church' distinct from the 'Universal Church.' Today there is a grave risk of the fragmentation of the Church, of breaking up the Mystical Body of Christ by insisting on the national identities of the Churches and thus on their capacity to decide for themselves, above all in the so crucial domain of doctrine and morals.

As St. Paul says: "There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling, one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is above all and through all and in all."
