
St. Paul the Apostle and Immaculate Conception Churches

FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Faith seeking understanding.

One of the milestones in my journey of faith was reading a small book entitled *The Three Ways of the Spiritual Life*. The author, Fr. Reginald Garrigou-Lagrange, concisely and clearly summarized the teachings of St. Thomas, St. Teresa of Avila and St. John of the Cross on the spiritual life. This was my introduction not only to the these great saints but also to the more extensive writings of Fr. Garrigou-Lagrange, who was famous for his courses on spiritual theology which he taught at the Angelicum in Rome for decades until his death in the early sixties. It was under his direction that Karol Wojtyla, the future Pope John Paul II, wrote his doctoral thesis.

Fr. Garrigou-Lagrange, along with Jacques Maritain and Etienne Gilson, was one of the great figures in "neoscholasticism." "Scholasticism" is essentially the theology of those who follow St. Thomas Aquinas. The 'neo-" refers to the "new" revival of the study of St. Thomas that was encouraged by Pope Leo XIII in the late 1800s. Because neo-scholasticism was so strongly endorsed by Pope Leo and his successors, it remained dominant until the eve of the Second Vatican Council.

By the mid-twentieth century, however, Catholic theology was taking new directions. In the view of the bright up-and-coming theologians, the problem with St. Thomas was his reliance on the philosophy of the ancient Greek philosopher Aristotle. How, they asked, can a twentieth century Church continue to teach a theology from the thirteenth century based on a philosophy from the fourth century B.C.? The genius of St. Thomas, they said, was that he based his theology on the best philosophy of his day, which happened to be Aristotle. The modern theologian, in the same way, to be true to St. Thomas, must base his theology on the best philosophy of his day. Thus, the advances in philosophy — Descartes, Kant, Hegel, etc. — must be taken into account. Only in this way can theology be made relevant to the mind of modern man.

Catholic theology after the Second Vatican Council followed two main tracks: the 'progressive' theology of the German Jesuit theologian Karl Rahner and the journal *Concilium*; and the more 'conservative' theology of the French Jesuit Henri de Lubac and the journal *Communio*. In her recent book, *Catholic Theology* Tracey Rowland wrote: "The tracks begin at the same junction (opposition to Neo-Scholasticism) but they do not converge or cross, and they end in very different places."

The 'progressive' theology of Rahner has not aged well and the course set by de Lubac is now considered 'mainstream.' Yet the theology of St. Thomas is continually being 'rediscovered.' Although Neo-Scholasticism is often unfairly described as 'logic-chopping exercises," its great strength is logic. Our faith is, as St. Paul said, a *logike latreia*, a *reasonable* worship.


