
St. Paul the Apostle and Immaculate Conception Churches

FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

"Why Men Do Not Believe."

This is the title of a book published in 1869 by Rev. Nicholas Laforet, the Rector of the University of Louvain. He rejects the hypothesis that religion has been abandoned because it is irrational and has been superseded by reason and science. He points out that most of the great scientists were sincere Christians. The late Fr. Stanley Jaki called Christ "the Saviour of Science." It is Christian dogma that God is an intelligent creator; that nature works according to intelligible laws; and that human beings are endowed with intellect which enables them to discover those laws.

The ancient Greeks defined "science" as "the knowledge of the causes of things." St. Thomas Aquinas added: "Natural things have natural causes, and supernatural things have supernatural causes." For the Christian scientist, just as much as for the atheist, God is an "unnecessary hypothesis" when it comes to purely natural things.

Even in natural things, however, we see what St. Augustine calls the *vestigia dei*, the fingerprints of God. We cannot have direct knowledge of God because God is not an object of the senses: we cannot see God, or hear him, or taste or smell or touch him; there is no sensor with which we can detect his presence. And yet, as St. Paul says, "What can be known about God is plain to them... Ever since the creation of the world, God's invisible nature, his eternal power and deity, have been clearly perceived, in the things that have been made. So they are without excuse."

We need only to look within ourselves, made in the image and likeness of God, to observe powers which transcend any natural laws: intellect, free will, and the capacity to love. These faculties cannot be explained by "evolutionary psychology" or "selfish genes" or any other natural causes. These are supernatural things. As beings created in God's likeness we share in God's own nature. God is intellect; God is perfect free will; God is love.

Fr. Laforet concludes that infidelity is not the result of superior intellect but, rather, infidelity arises from "the moral condition of the soul; it comes from this, that the state of our understanding depends in great measure on the state of our will and affections." (Infidelity is not the result of a high intellectual IQ but of a low moral IQ.) "All our faculties are mutually affected, and exercise an incessant action upon one another. Nothing is easier than to refute a materialist, but it is not so easy to cure him."

Cardinal Newman likewise said of those who turn away from God: "Their doubts are *moral* ones, arising in their root from the fault of the will." When Newman says that their doubts are *moral*, he doesn't mean that these doubts are therefore *excusable*. In fact, he means the opposite: "We can believe what we choose. We are answerable for what we choose to believe."

As St. John says in his Gospel: "The light has come into the world, and men loved darkness rather than the light."
