
St. Paul the Apostle and Immaculate Conception Churches

FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

What earlier generations held as sacred.

The use of Latin in the Church ought to be embraced warmly as an essential and cherished part of our Catholic culture. As Pope Benedict XVI said:

A community is calling its very being into question when it suddenly declares that what until now was its holiest and highest possession is strictly forbidden and when it makes the longing for it seem downright indecent. — Cardinal Ratzinger (Pope Benedict XVI)

One of the great harms of residential schools was the loss of indigenous languages and the resulting effect on indigenous culture and identity. As Catholics, Latin is our indigenous language. The loss of Latin has in great part contributed to our loss of Catholic identity. The tragedy is compounded by the fact that this is a self-inflicted wound.

Many Catholics are under the impression that Latin was abolished in the 1960s by the Second Vatican Council. To the contrary, the Council said:

Particular law remaining in force, the use of the Latin language is to be preserved in the Latin rites. But since the use of the mother tongue, whether in the Mass, the administration of the sacraments, or other parts of the liturgy, frequently may be of great advantage to the people, the limits of its employment may be extended.

The continued use of Latin is particularly insisted on in relation to the sung parts of the Mass:

The musical tradition of the universal Church is a treasure of inestimable value, greater even than that of any other art. [...] The Church acknowledges Gregorian (Latin) Chant as specially suited to the Roman liturgy: therefore, other things being equal, it should be given pride of place in liturgical services.

In the Apostolic Exhortation *Sacramentum Caritatis* which followed the Bishops' Synod on the Eucharist in 2005, Pope Benedict wrote: "I desire, in accordance with the request advanced by the Synod Fathers that Gregorian (Latin) Chant be suitably esteemed and employed as the chant proper to the Roman Liturgy."

The current edition of the Missal, which came into use only seven years ago, states that "it is fitting that the faithful know how to sing at least some parts of the Ordinary of the Mass in Latin, set to simpler melodies." Those "simpler melodies" were mandated by Pope Paul VI in 1974 "to make it easier for Christians to achieve unity and spiritual harmony with their brothers and with the living tradition of the past."

Again, to go back to the words of Pope Benedict XVI:

"It behooves us to preserve the riches which have developed in the Church's faith and prayer and to give them their proper place. What earlier generations held as sacred remains sacred and great for us too and it cannot be all of a sudden forbidden or even considered harmful."




