
St. Paul the Apostle and Immaculate Conception Churches

FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

For all find what they truly seek.

For summer reading I took up C. S. Lewis' classic *Chronicles of Narnia*. Like all good "children's literature" these books also appeal to the adult reader. The magical land of Narnia, like our own world, is a place where evil contends with good. The great lion Aslan is an image of Christ, the biblical 'lion of Judah." And as we are often reminded, Aslan is not a *tame* lion, but he *is* good.

In the final book of the series, there is a soldier in the enemy army whose name is Emeth. He is a sincere devotee of Tash, the cruel god of his people, a god who demands human sacrifice. At the end of the story he meets Aslan:

Then I fell at his feet and thought, Surely this is the hour of death, for the Lion will know that I have served Tash all my days and not him. Nevertheless, it is better to see the Lion and die than to live and not to have seen him. But the Glorious One bent down his golden head and said, "Son, thou art welcome." But I said, "Alas Lord, I am no son of thine but the servant of Tash." He answered, "Child, all the service thou hast done to Tash, I account as service done to me." Then by reasons of my great desire for wisdom and understanding, I overcame my fear and questioned the Glorious One and said, "Lord, is it then true that thou and Tash are one?" The Lion growled so that the earth shook and said, "It is false. Not because he and I are one, but because we are opposites, I take to me the services which thou hast done to him. For I and he are of such different kinds that no service which is vile can be done to me, and none which is not vile can be done to him. Therefore if any man swear by Tash and keep his oath for the oath's sake, it is by me that he has truly sworn, though he know it not, and it is I who reward him. And if any man do a cruelty in my name, then, though he says the name Aslan, it is Tash whom he serves and by Tash his deed is accepted. Dost thou understand, Child?" I said, "Lord, though knowest how much I understand." But I said also (for the truth constrained me), "Yet I have been seeking Tash all my days." "Beloved," said the Glorious One, "unless thy desire had been for me thou wouldst not have sought so long and so truly. For all find what they truly seek."

Lewis' great gift as a story-teller is to communicate profound theological truths in the guise of a simple story for children. What strikes me about this passage is this: Aslan does not say that because Emeth was sincere in his service to Tash, therefore *whatever* he did for Tash was taken as service to Aslan. No, Tash and Aslan *are not one*! Whatever Emeth did that was truly *good* was service to Aslan. And whatever the servants of Aslan did that was truly *evil* was actually service to Tash. I don't know if it was intended, but in Hebrew the word *emeth* means "truth."
