## FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

## Financial accountability.

When I was appointed Pastor of St. Paul's in September 2011, I was pleased to find that the previous Pastor, Fr. Tad Walczyk, already had in place an excellent system for financial accountability.

All the money coming into the parish is processed with the Sunday collection and immediately deposited into our parish bank account. All the money going out of the parish is paid from our bank account. Everything is documented on paper as well as in our computer accounting program. The accounts are balanced every month and every penny is accounted for.

The good thing about this system is that all money coming into the parish goes through the money counters and is documented. All money going out of the parish goes out through our office manager, Deborah, who is the only person who writes cheques. The Pastor has no direct access to the bank account or to the accounting program. I do not write any cheques; but I do sign every cheque.

The only thing that I was not happy with when I arrived in 2011 was the level of detail in our bookkeeping accounts. For, example, if I wanted to know the cost of fuel oil for the rectory, that figure was not available because fuel costs were lumped in with other expenses. We could get the figure by going back to our filed invoices, but not from the bookkeeping program. Our accounting method was tailored to providing reports to the Archdiocese, but was less than ideal for our own financial management.

In 2015 I spent the entire summer going through two full years of our parish accounts in detail. The result of this effort was the reorganization our bookkeeping accounts with the addition of sub-accounts to keep track of specific categories of income and expense. This lets us know easily where the money is coming from and where it is going.

We are currently using the QuickBooks program for our bookkeeping. The Archdiocese of Toronto, however, has lately developed its own in-house accounting program and all parishes will eventually be forced to switch over. This is a good thing in so far as it lets the Archdiocese exercise more effective overview of parish finances. On the other hand, it means that we will have to use the standardized accounts and sub-accounts with some resulting loss of flexibility. This simply proves the dictum that every upgrade is also a downgrade.

The parish is like any family household. There are constantly bills to pay. Most of our expenditures are for daily operating expenses: staff salaries, taxes, heating and power, office supplies, etc. Occasionally there will be a bigticket items like the recent replacement of the roofs over the sacristy and kitchen; such major expenditures have to be submitted to the Archdiocese for approval. Our Parish Finance Council, which consists mainly of long-time parishioners, keeps us on the straight and narrow.
