FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

They have received their reward..

Some parishes, as part of their sacramental preparation for First Communion or Confirmation, require attendance at a certain number of Sundays Masses. While we commend the good intentions behind this requirement, we also think that it sends the wrong message: that going to Mass on Sunday is something out of the ordinary. Pope John Paul II, in his Encyclical for the new millennium wrote:

Celebrating the Eucharist must be the heart of Sunday for *every baptized person*. It is a fundamental duty, to be fulfilled not just in order to observe a precept but as something felt as essential to a truly informed and consistent Christian life.

Every Sunday, the Risen Christ asks us to meet him once more in the Upper Room where, on the evening of "the first day of the week" he appeared to his disciples in order to "breathe" on them his life-giving Spirit and launch them on the great adventure of proclaiming the Gospel.

The Eucharist is, in fact, "the source and summit of the Christian life." The Catechism of the Catholic Church says:

The other sacraments, and indeed all ecclesiastical ministries and works of the apostolate, are bound up with the Eucharist and are oriented toward it. For in the blessed Eucharist is contained the whole spiritual good of the Church, namely Christ himself.

The Sunday Eucharist is the foundation and confirmation of all Christian practice. For this reason the faithful are obliged to participate in the Eucharist on days of obligation, unless excused for a serious reason (for example, illness, the care of infants) or dispensed by their own pastor. Those who deliberately fail in this obligation commit a grave sin.

Pope John Paul also says: "Sin is not merely to deny God, but also to live as if he did not exist, to eliminate him from one's daily life." This is what we do when we ignore God's commandment to "keep holy the Sabbath day."

If, then, the Eucharist is so extremely important why not insist on it as a requirement for receiving the Sacraments?

"Whenever you pray, do not be like the hypocrites; for they love to stand and pray in the synagogues and at the street corners, so that they may be seen by others. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward." — Matthew 6:5

If we come to the Eucharist in order to honor and worship God and to receive from him all the graces that we need to live the Christian life, then God bestows on us all those graces, and more, in abundance. However, if we come to the Eucharist not to receive grace, but only to satisfy an obligation, then that is the extent of our reward; God owes us nothing else. If we make the Eucharist nothing more than a requirement for the Sacraments what exactly are we promoting, devotion or hypocrisy?
