FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

The Regensburg Lecture — Faith and Reason.

In 2006, Pope Benedict XVI (Joseph Ratzinger) gave a lecture at the University of Regensburg with the title, *Faith, Reason and the University*, in which he reflects on what ought to be considered a self-evident proposition: "Not to act in accordance with reason is contrary to God's nature."

St. John began his Gospel: "In the beginning was the *logos.*" The Greek word *logos* means both "reason" and "word" — a reason which is creative and capable of self-communication, precisely as reason. John thus spoke the final word on the biblical concept of God, and in this word all the threads of biblical faith find their culmination and synthesis. In the beginning was the *logos*, and the *logos* is God, says the Evangelist. The encounter between the Biblical message and Greek thought did not happen by chance. Biblical faith encountered the best of Greek thought at a deep level, resulting in a mutual enrichment.

Pope Benedict goes on to trace the process, beginning at the time of the Protestant Reformation, to return to a purely "biblical" faith, free from any influence of our common Greek intellectual heritage. This process continued in the nineteenth century when liberal theology sharply distinguished the "God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob" from the "God of the philosophers." Faith being divorced from reason, religion entered the realm of the merely subjective:

The individual then decides, on the basis of his own experiences, what he considers acceptable in matters of religion, and the subjective "conscience" becomes the sole judge of what is ethical. In this way, ethics and religion lose their power to create a community and become a completely personal matter.

Pope Benedict then points to the current stage in this process of rejecting the essential contribution of the Greek heritage of rationality to Christianity:

In the light of our experience with cultural pluralism, it is often said nowadays that the synthesis with Greek thought in the early Church was a type of *inculturation* which ought not to be binding on other cultures, which have the right to return to the simple message of the scriptures in order to inculturate it anew in their own particular milieu.

Pope Benedict, however, forcefully rejects this idea: The New Testament was written in Greek and bears the imprint of the Greek spirit. The fundamental decisions made about the relationship between faith and the use of human reason are part of the faith itself — they are developments consistent with the nature of faith itself.
