Saint of the Week:

The first end I propose in our daily work is to do the will of God; secondly, to do it in the manner he wills it; and thirdly to do it because it is his will. - Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton (1774-1821), Patron Saint of Widows, Feast Day January 4

Reform and renewal.

For the utmost we have to do at first is to take care of our soul and to remember that in the entire world there is only God and the soul; and this is a thing which it is very profitable to remember. — St. Teresa of Avila (1515-1582)

In a thumbnail description of St. Teresa we are told that she was "a prolific author and theologian," and that she "attempted to reform the Carmelite Order that she believed had allowed its members to enjoy too much of a life of comfort." I am going to quibble with that description.

St. Teresa has the rare distinction of being a "Doctor of the Church," and you cannot find any modern book on Christian prayer that does not refer to her writings, but she was neither prolific nor a theologian. That is a minor quibble; the more important quibble is this: St. Teresa did *not* attempt to reform the Carmelite Order.

At the age of twenty Teresa entered the Carmelite Convent of the Incarnation in Avila, Spain. This was a large community of over 150 nuns. Life there was "comfortable" but not what we would today describe as "lax." The nuns lived a life of prayer according to the rules of their Order.

Teresa, however, was being called to a life of *deeper* prayer. Her good friend, St. Peter of Alcantara, had begun a community of Franciscan friars who followed the original austere rule of St. Francis of Assisi. Because they did not wear shoes (Latin, *calceus*), they were called "discalced," i.e., shoe-less. Teresa was inspired to form a similar small community of nuns, living a life of intense prayer and penance, based on the "primitive" rule of Carmel.

What needs to be stressed is this: St. Teresa never intended to reform the Carmelite Order; she did not even want to reform her own Convent of the Incarnation. The only thing Teresa ever wanted to reform was herself. In fact, much later, when the Convent of the Incarnation was going through difficulties, St. Teresa was put in charge. She did not impose any reforms, but gently guided the nuns to faithfully follow their own "mitigated" rule.

Jesus says to the first generation of Christians in the Book of Revelation: "I have this against you: You have lost the love you had at first. ... You have a name of being alive but you are dead. ... You are lukewarm, neither hot nor cold." As in that first age, so in every age, the fire of love of God grows cold and needs to be rekindled.

St. Teresa was born just two years before the start of the Luther's 'Protestant Reformation' in Germany, and we are tempted to regard her as part of a "Catholic Reformation." If that were the case, she would be of only historical interest. Rather, St. Teresa was part of a dynamic movement of spiritual revival. What the Church needed then was not reform of structures, but conversion of heart.

This is the perennial value of St. Teresa. She is a remarkable Saint whose spiritual guidance is applicable to every age, and indeed to every Christian soul.
