## FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Solidly established on the rock of Jesus Christ.

"The outlook on the future is by no means free of anxiety." So wrote Pope Leo XIII at the start of the 20th century. We can say the same thing today. We cannot avoid having grave concerns, even *anxiety*, when we reflect on the many aspects of the current crisis in the Catholic Church.

Fr. R. J. Neuhaus said repeatedly: "The current crisis is about three things: fidelity, fidelity, and fidelity. The lack thereof is the cause and the recovery thereof is the remedy." According to Pope John Paul II: "We do not need a new program. The program already exists: it is the plan found in the Gospel. It is the same as ever. It has its center in Christ himself, who is to be known, loved and imitated."

The fact is that neither you nor I can reform the Church. In the 16th century Martin Luther set out to reform the Church and ended up denouncing the Church as the anti-Christ. Around the same time, Teresa of Avila set out to live a hidden life of prayer and she was the spark that ignited an astonishing spiritual revival. This true reform of the Church was the work of the Holy Spirit as grace built upon nature. If we set out to reform *others*, we are headed for disaster. Reform has to start, and can only start, with ourselves.

Fr. Groeschel, in The Reform of Renewal, wrote:

The reform of the Church begins with *individuals* — but this personal reform is the fruit of divine grace and must be shared with the Church. Reform will come when our attempts are solidly established on the rock of Jesus Christ as He is presented to us by the Scriptures and the Tradition of the Church and her dogmas and theological teaching. One thing that is not being tried in any particularly enthusiastic way by people who call themselves Catholics is Catholicism!

There is some truth in the aphorism: "Be the change you want to see." The way to make the Church holy is to be holy. Now, as much as ever, we need to take to heart the words of Pope John Paul II which he spoke at the beginning of his pontificate (more than forty years ago!):

Today, we cannot stop at a Christian faith that is superficial or mere sociology. It is necessary to arrive at the clear and certain conviction of the truth of one's Christian faith, namely, in the first place, the historicity and divinity of Christ and the mission of the Church which he willed and founded. When one is really convinced that Jesus is the Word Incarnate and that he is still present in the Church, then one accepts his "word" completely, because it is a divine word which does not deceive, which does not contradict itself, and which gives us the true and only meaning of life and eternity. Jesus alone, in fact, has "words of eternal life." He alone is the way, the truth and the life! Jesus is not an idea, a sentiment or a memory. Jesus is always alive and present with us.
