FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Only the good has depth and can be radical.

Who can imagine the extent of the shame that will engulf us and our children once the scales fall from our eyes and crimes monstrous beyond all measure are revealed? — White Rose pamphlet, Germany, 1942

New York State has passed legislation permitting the abortion of infants at any stage of pregnancy, even up to the moment of birth. Anyone with the least moral sense is horrified at this full-out embrace of the culture of death. Few people, however, realise that in Canada there are also absolutely no limitations on abortion, which has been legal since 1969! How did we get to the point where we can euphemistically refer to the intentional killing of full-term healthy babies as "reproductive rights"? This is utterly evil.

Hannah Arendt, the German Jewish philosopher, used the phrase "the banality of evil" to describe how evil can be done "under circumstances that make it well-nigh impossible for one to know or to feel that he is doing wrong." Pope John Paul II, similarly, wrote in *Evangelium Vitae*, "the Gospel of Life": "Conscience itself, darkened by widespread conditioning, is finding it increasingly difficult to distinguish between good and evil in what concerns the basic value of human life."

Hannah Arendt purposely does not speak of '*radical* evil' because evil does not have any *depth*: "Evil can overgrow and lay waste the whole world precisely because it spreads like a fungus on the surface. It is 'thought-defying' because thought tries to reach some depth, to go to the roots, but the moment that it concerns itself with evil, it is frustrated because there is nothing there. That is its 'banality.' Only the good has depth and can be radical."

St. Augustine said the same thing: "Evil, unless it is parasitic on something good, cannot exist at all. A man or an angel can exist and yet not be wicked, but there cannot be wickedness except *in* a man or an angel. It is good to be a man or an angel; but it is evil to be wicked. If there is no good, then evil can have no mode in which to exist. Evil is a corruption of the good."

C. S. Lewis continues this thought: "To be evil, Satan must exist and have intellect and free will, which are in themselves good. Even to be evil, the devil must borrow or steal from the good. Do you now see why Christianity has always said that Satan is a fallen *angel*? It is a recognition that evil is a *parasite*, not the original thing."

One of the greatest goods in this world is the procreation of new life. A baby is God's most precious gift. As St. Augustine said, even if children come unplanned, when we see them we cannot help but love them. The New York legislature actually cheered the passage of their thought-defying abortion law with a standing ovation! They consider themselves champions of "reproductive rights." They do not *know* or *feel* that they are doing wrong. What shame will engulf us when the scales fall from our eyes!
