Reading the Psalms with St. Augustine.

The Holy Scriptures were written under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, and it is the Saints, filled with the Holy Spirit, who can best interpret them. The Holy Spirit gives them a deep penetration into the Word of God.

St. Augustine gave a series of sermons on the Psalms. These were taken down verbatim in shorthand and later copied out in full. All of them are now available in modern translation. The key to reading the Psalms, according to St. Augustine, is that they speak to us about Christ:

The whole Christ consists of head and body. The *head* is our Savior himself, who suffered under Pontius Pilate, rose from the dead, and is now seated at the right hand of the Father. His *body* is the Church: not this or that local church but the Church that extends throughout the world. It is made up not only of people alive today, for those who have gone before us also belong to the Church, and so do those who will come after us, even to the end of time. All the faithful are Christ's members, and the Church is thus made up of all who believe. The head of the Church is enthroned in heaven; the body is linked to him by charity.

In St. Augustine's day, the Church was still using an old Latin translation of the Psalms. If you look at Psalm 57 in the NRSV Bible you will see that it begins with a heading: "To the (choir) *leader*." But the Old Latin translation reads, "To the *end*." So Augustine asks: "What is 'the end'?"

The 'end' is Christ! Christ is the end of all our striving because, no matter how hard we try, we are made perfect only in him and by him. Our perfection is to reach him. But when we reach him we will look for nothing further, for he is our end. When you are on a journey, your end is the place you are making for, and when you reach it, then you will stay. Similarly the end of your endeavor, of your enterprise, of your striving and your intention, is he to whom you are making your way; and when you reach him, you will desire nothing further, because you could never have anything better. Christ has set us an example of how to live our lives here, and he will give us our reward in the life to come.

The deficient translation that Augustine used was not an impediment. As Fr. Garrigou-Lagrange comments:

A great painter can, with a most imperfect brush, paint a beautiful picture. In the same way, St. Augustine, using an imperfect translation, produced a wonderful theological work. In these great doctors of the Church we see that Faith, illuminated by the gifts of Understanding and Wisdom, can make use of even an inaccurate translation.

The great Doctor of the Church, St. Teresa of Avila, writes at one point in a profound meditation on the *Song of Songs*: "It matters little if what I say is not exactly what the passage means provided that we benefit from the thoughts."
