Saint of the Week:

Two very bad things are ill-will and unbelief, both of which are contrary to righteousness; for ill-will is opposed to charity, and unbelief to faith; just in the same way as bitterness is opposed to sweetness, darkness to light, evil to good, death to life, falsehood to truth. - St. Alexander of Alexandria (250-328), Defender of the Faith, Feast Day February 26

FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

For the trial of our hearts.

"Truth and falsehood are set before us for the trial of our hearts." So writes Cardinal Newman in his famous *Essay on the Development of Christian Doctrine*. It is a fundamental truth that we often forget, but it is just an echo of the Jesus' own words: "And this is the judgment, that the light has come into the world, and people loved darkness rather than light because their deeds were evil."

Some Evangelical Christians speak of being "convicted by the Holy Spirit." This means that if one is in a state of sin, the Holy Spirit will make one plainly aware it. This is morally dubious because one can blithely continue sinning with the excuse that one has not *yet* been convicted by the Spirit. Catholics have a version of this as well, which is often expressed as 'the primacy of conscience.'

It always wrong to act against one's conscience, but this does not mean that conscience alone determines right and wrong. If we make our personal conscience the final judge of morality, then we have what Mgr. Ronald Knox called "mind over matter: if I don't mind, then it doesn't matter." Jesus did not say, "Do whatever you think is right." He said, "If you love me, you will keep my commandments."

Cardinal Newman is often presented as the champion of the rights of conscience. His famous "toast" at the end of his *Letter to the Duke of Norfolk* is often quoted: "Certainly, if I am obliged to bring religion into after-dinner toasts (which indeed does not seem quite the thing) I shall drink — to the Pope, if you please — still, to Conscience first and to the Pope afterwards."

But he also says this: "Conscience has *rights* because it has *duties*; but in this age, with a large portion of the public, it is the very right and freedom of conscience to dispense with conscience, to ignore a Lawgiver and Judge, to be independent of unseen obligations. Conscience is a stern monitor, but in this century it has been superseded by a counterfeit, which the eighteen centuries prior to it never heard of, and could not have mistaken for it, if they had. It is the right of self-will."

There is a great danger in these present times that when we hear of the "rights of conscience" what is meant is the "triumph of the will." We need to keep in mind that when our personal conscience makes judgment between right and wrong, it is our conscience that is also being judged. The words of Christ should be a warning:

I do not judge anyone who hears my words and does not keep them, for I came not to judge the world, but to save the world. The one who rejects me and does not receive my word has a judge; on the last day the word that I have spoken will serve as judge.

St. Augustine says: "In this life virtue is nothing else but the love of that which ought to be loved." If we love God, we will strive to live according to his word. That is the test of our conscience and the trial of our hearts.
