FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Cracked cisterns that can hold no water.

But understand this, that in the last days distressing times will come. For men will be lovers of pleasure rather than lovers of God, holding form of religion, but denying the power of it. — 2 Tim 3:1-5

St. Paul speaks of 'the last days' not as some time in the far distant future, but as an era that has already begun; it is his own time and it is equally our own time. The Church, in her two thousand year history, has been living in these 'last days.' Cardinal Newman, reflecting on this history, wrote:

The whole course of Christianity is but one series of troubles and disorders. Every century is like every other and seems worse than all times before. Religion seems ever expiring, schisms dominant, the light of Truth dim, its adherents scattered. The cause of Christ is ever in its last agony, as though it were but a question of time whether it fails this day or another. But let us not be anxious at the troubles which encompass us. They have ever been; they shall ever be; they are our portion.

There is no 'golden age' of the Church to look back on. The high middle ages gave us Chartres Cathedral, the University of Paris, great Saints like Bernard of Clairvaux and Thomas Aquinas, and Dante's Divine Comedy. But this was also an era of intense political storms that so battered the Church that many feared for her survival. The storms passed and were forgotten; the achievements lived on.

Today we are living in what Cardinal Newman foresaw as a "time of widespread infidelity." In the developed countries of the West, the most common religion is 'none.' We can delve into the reasons for this 'great apostasy' in terms of philosophy or sociology, but we will find the root cause to be what it always has been, the desire to be free from the moral restraints of religion. As St. Augustine long ago pointed out: "And this is all that evil is: the soul that will not enter into the covenant with its God."

Long ago, the prophet Jeremiah denounced the people because they had turned away from God, "the spring of living water, and have dug their own cisterns, cracked cisterns that can hold no water." Authentic reform of the Church and of the culture can only come about by a return to "the spring of living water."

Pope John Paul II said: "We do not need a new program. The program already exists! It is the plan found in the Gospel and in the living Tradition. It is the same as ever. Ultimately, it has its center in Christ himself, who is to be known, loved and imitated."

Authentic reform can only be based on unwavering faith in and devotion to Jesus Christ. Decades ago, Ralph Martin accurately named the current crisis in the Church: it is a "Crisis of Truth." If we are to renew the Church and evangelize the culture, we must boldly follow him who is "the Way, the Truth and the Life."
