

FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

All Souls' Day — Saturday, November 2nd

Each year we dedicate one day expressly to prayer for the holy souls in Purgatory. According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church:

All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation, but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven. The Church gives the name of Purgatory to this final purification of the elect.

The Letter to the Hebrews says, "Pursue holiness, without which no man shall see the Lord." Cardinal Newman, comments on this text:

Suppose that a man of unholy life was permitted to enter heaven; he would not be happy there. Heaven is not a place of happiness *except* to the holy. If we wished to punish an unholy, reprobate soul, we perhaps could not imagine a greater punishment than to summon it to heaven. Heaven would be hell to an irreligious man.

Such is the case of the guest at the wedding banquet in the parable. He is accosted by his host: "Friend, how did you get in here without a wedding garment?" The 'wedding garment' that we need to enter Heaven is a soul free from any stain of sin. Few attain that state of holiness in this life, so it is necessary to be purified after death.

According to St. Catherine of Genoa (1447-1510):

At the moment of death, the soul, of its own volition, hurls itself into purgatory. God has placed no doors between purgatory and paradise. Whoever wishes to enter heaven may do so. All-merciful God stands with His arms open, waiting to receive us into his glory. However, that divine essence is so pure and light-filled (much more than we can imagine) that the soul that has but the slightest imperfection would rather throw itself into a thousand hells than appear thus before the divine presence.

Tongue cannot express nor the heart understand the full meaning of purgatory, which the soul willingly accepts as a mercy. Its suffering is of no importance compared to the removal of the impediment of sin.

The greatest suffering of the souls in purgatory, it seems to me, is their awareness that something in them displeases God — that they have deliberately gone against his great goodness. Being in a state of grace, these souls fully grasp the meaning of what blocks them on their way to God. This conviction is so strong that, by comparison, all words, sentiments, images, the very idea of justice and truth, seem completely false.

Compared to God's love, the suffering of purgatory is a small matter. The soul is like gold that becomes purer as it is fired. Having come to the point of twenty-four carats, gold cannot be purified any further; and this is what happens to the soul in the fire of God's love.


