FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

O come, O come, Emmanuel.

Today is the First Sunday of Advent and the beginning of a new liturgical year. We begin this Church year with an attitude of expectation and hope. The season of Advent recalls the many years during which the people of Israel were longing for the coming of the Messiah, the 'anointed one', in Greek, the *Christos*. We express this longing in our Advent hymns, such as "O come, O come, Emmanuel" and "O come, divine Messiah."

In depictions of the Annunciation, Mary is often shown reading or praying. She is reading the books of the Prophets, with their promise of the coming Messiah. She is praying that the promise may soon be fulfilled. In the midst of this longing, the Angel Gabriel appears to announce that Mary herself will bear the Messiah in her womb. Mary's response is, "Let it be done to me according to your word."

One of the titles of the Messiah is given in the book of the prophet Habakkuk and quoted in the Letter to the Hebrews: "In just a little while, *he who is coming* will come and will not delay." When the disciples of John the Baptist are inquiring whether Jesus is indeed the Messiah, they ask him, "Are you *he who is coming*, or are we to wait for another?" When Martha professes her faith, she says, "Yes, Lord, I believe that you are the Messiah, the Son of God, *he who is coming* into the world."

The Messiah has come! He came two thousand years ago, conceived in the womb of the virgin Mary in Nazareth and born in a stable in Bethlehem. And yet he is still *he who is coming*. The Messiah came to fulfill the promise of the Old Covenant and, at the same time, he institutes the beginning of a New Covenant. Jesus' incarnation, death and resurrection are once-and-for-all events, but the effects of those events are still unfolding in the present.

In this season of Advent we do not only recall what happened long ago. We imaginatively enter into Mary's prayer for the coming of the Messiah and the fulfillment of the Old Covenant, but we also look to the future, to the fulfillment of the New Covenant when, as St. Paul says, "God will be all in all." Then there is also a coming that is between these past and future comings.

As St. Bernard of Clarivaux, in a sermon on Advent, said: "Because this present coming lies between the other two, it is like a road on which we travel from the first coming to the last. In the first, Christ was our redemption; in the last, he will appear as our life; in this middle coming, he is our rest and consolation." Let us open our hearts to this present coming of Christ into our lives.

O come, O come, Emmanuel And ransom captive Israel That mourns in lonely exile here Until the Son of God appear. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel Shall come to thee, O Israel.
