FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Tolle, lege — pick it up and read it.

St. Augustine's spiritual autobiography *The Confessions* is one of the all-time great books of world literature. It is the story of Augustine's long search for God. The climax of the story comes when Augustine, convinced of the truth of the Gospel, is on the verge of conversion, but cannot make the final act of will. In agonies of indecision, he takes refuge in a garden that is attached to the house where he is staying.

For I felt that I was still the captive of my sins, and in my misery I kept crying, "How long shall I go on saying 'tomorrow, tomorrow'? Why not now? Why not make an end of my ugly sins at this moment?" Then, all at once, I heard the singing voice of a child in a nearby house repeating "tolle, lege — take it up, read it."

So I hurried back to the place where I had put down a book containing the Letters of St. Paul. I seized it and opened it, and in silence I read: "Not in reveling and drunkenness, not in lust and wantonness, not in quarrels and rivalries. Rather, arm yourself with the Lord Jesus Christ; spend no more thought on nature and nature's appetites."

I had no wish to read more and no need to do so. For in an instant, as I came to the end of the sentence, it was as though the light of confidence flooded into my heart and all the darkness of doubt was dispelled.

Thomas Merton, in his autobiography, *The Seven Storey Mountain*, recounts similarly agonizing over whether he had a vocation to a Trappist monastery, where the monks spend most of the day in silence. He decided to do what St. Augustine had done and consult the Scriptures.

It was the old business of opening the Bible and putting your finger down blindly on the page and taking those words as the answer to your question. Sometimes the saints have done this, but more often it is done by superstitious old women. Anyway, I opened the book and put down my finger, and the answer practically floored me: 'Behold, thou shalt be silent.' It was in Luke's gospel, where the angel is talking to John the Baptist's father, Zachary.

Silent! There could not have been a closer word to 'Trappist' in the whole Bible, for to me, the word 'Trappist' stood for 'silence.' However, I immediately found myself in difficulties, which shows how silly it is to make an oracle out of the Bible. As soon as I looked at the context, I observed that Zachary was being reproved for asking too many questions. Was I also being reproved? The information that I had asked for was a greater cause of uncertainty than my original ignorance.

Often, when we read Scripture, we find the very words of encouragement that we need at that time. As long as we do not use the Bible as a means of superstitious divination, we can profit from those words that Augustine heard in the garden: *Tolle, lege*. Pick it up! Read it!
