FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Weekday Mass readings.

There was a certain man of Ramathaim-zophim of the hill country of Ephraim, whose name was Elkanah the son of Jeroham, son of Elihu, son of Tohu, son of Zuph, an Ephraimite. He had two wives; the name of the one was Hannah, and the name of the other Penninah. and Penninah had children, but Hannah had no children.

Thus begins the First Book of Samuel. We have lately been reading through this book in sizeable chunks at weekday Mass. The story begins with the barren Hannah praying to the Lord for a child. When God answers her prayer, she names the child Samuel, which means "God hears," and she then brings the child to the Sanctuary of the Lord to be brought up there by the priest Eli, to serve the Lord "as long as he lives."

At that time the people of Israel did not have a king, but relied on 'judges' to settle disputes among them. When Eli and his sons die, Samuel becomes a 'judge' over Israel: "And he went on a circuit year by year to Bethel, Gilgal, and Mizpah; and he judged Israel in all these places. Then he would come back to Ramah, for his home was there, and there he also administered justice to Israel."

When Samuel is growing old, the people come to him, clamoring for a king "to govern us like the nations." Samuel explains all the evils that a king will inflict upon them, but the people insist: "No! but we will have a king over us!" So Samuel anoints the tall and handsome Saul as king. Saul proves to be a mighty war leader.

There comes a time when a great army of Philistines has mustered to fight Israel, and Saul gathers his own troops at Gilgal. There he waits for Samuel, so that Samuel can offer a sacrifice to the Lord to grant a successful outcome to the impending battle. After several days, when Samuel has still not arrived, and the soldiers are starting to slip away, Saul offers the sacrifice himself. No sooner is this done, than Samuel arrives, and he rebukes Saul: "You have done foolishly! You have not kept the commandment of the Lord your God, which he commanded you; for now the Lord would have established your kingdom over Israel forever. But now your kingdom shall not continue; the Lord has sought out a man after his own heart; and the Lord has appointed him to be prince over his people, because you have not kept what the Lord commanded you." Samuel will go on to anoint David as the successor to Saul.

Of course there is much more to the story. We can look on it as simple history, with very human characters exhibiting both virtues and vices. But it also has profound moral lessons throughout. Actions have consequences. Hannah's anguished prayer is answered; Samuel's fidelity is honored; Saul's lack of trust in the Lord — despite his many virtues — leads to his downfall. And most importantly, throughout all the twists and turns of events, God's providence is constantly at work.
