

FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Never tire of speaking out in defense of life.

The right to life is the pre-eminent social, cultural and moral issue of our times. Last week, for the very first time, a U.S. President attended the *March for Life* in Washington, D.C. In past years, President Trump has addressed the *March* via video; this year he was there in person. For those who have not seen his speech, here are some highlights:

All of us here understand an eternal truth: Every child is a precious and sacred gift from God. Together, we must protect, cherish, and defend the dignity and the sanctity of every human life. When we see the image of a baby in the womb, we glimpse the majesty of God's creation. When we hold a newborn in our arms, we know the endless love that each child brings to a family. When we watch a child grow, we see the splendor that radiates from each human soul. One life changes the world.

We cannot know what our citizens yet unborn will achieve. The dreams they will imagine. The masterpieces they will create. The discoveries they will make. But we know this: every life brings love into this world. Every child brings joy to a family. Every person is worth protecting. And above all, we know that every human soul is divine and every human life, born and unborn, is made in the holy image of Almighty God. With determined hope, we look forward to all of the blessings that will come from the beauty, talent, purpose, nobility, and grace of every child.

I know fully well that I will be criticized for praising President Trump for his support of a culture of life. But to be fair, if President Obama had addressed the *March for Life* at any time during his eight years in office, pro-lifers would have been absolutely over the moon in their joy. It never happened. If a Democrat wins the U. S. presidency in November, it would be fantastic to see him (or her) at next year's *March for Life*. However, there is little hope of that since all the Democratic candidates have declared their support for abortion on demand through all nine months of pregnancy, even the Catholic Joe Biden. In fact, Elizabeth Warren has pledged to wear a Planned Parenthood scarf at her inauguration, if she is elected.

Perhaps one day a Canadian Prime Minister will address the *March of Life* in Ottawa. We can pray for that eventuality — and at the same time, exercise our *vote* to make it happen.

In his landmark Encyclical, *Evangelium Vitae*, 'The Gospel of Life,' Pope John Paul II wrote that "believers in Christ must defend and promote the right to life" and that we must recognize "the incomparable value of every human person." Let us take to heart the words of Pope John Paul: "Never tire of firmly speaking out in defense of life from its conception and do not be deterred from the commitment to defend the dignity of every human person with courageous determination. Christ is with you: BE NOT AFRAID!"
