FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:

Cor ad cor loquitur — heart speaks to heart.

I began writing the bulletin column ten years ago when I first came here as Pastor. The inspiration came from Fr. Charles Forget. My first assignment as Associate Pastor was with Fr. Charles at St. John Vianney Church in Barrie, in 2008. He wrote an original piece each Sunday which was insightful with usually more than a touch of humor. He made it look easy. I decided to take on that tradition as my own, not realizing the amount of work that often goes into making things look easy.

Surely, how hard can it be? The great English writer William Cobbett instructed his son on the proper method:

Sit down to write what you have thought, and not to think what you shall write. Use the first words that occur to you, and never attempt to alter a thought; for, that which has come of itself into your mind is likely to pass into that of another more readily and with more effect than anything which you can, by reflection, invent. If you clearly understand all about your topic, you will never want thoughts, and thoughts instantly become words.

Never stop to make a *choice* of words. Put down your thoughts just as they come. Follow the order which your thought will point out; and it will push you to get it upon the paper as quickly as possible.

Thoughts come much faster than we can put them upon paper. They produce one another; and, this order of their coming is, in almost every case, the best possible order that they can have upon paper.

It sounds easy, but few have Cobbett's natural gift for expression. As for myself, the words rarely flow easily onto the page and then they must be licked into shape.

My great Saint Augustine shared Cobbett's rare talent. The richness of his thoughts poured forth in his writings and in the spoken word. Augustine believed that the word that comes from the lips stops when it reaches the listener's ear; however, the word that comes from the heart does not stop until it reaches another human heart. It is this insight of Augustine's that John Henry Newman used for his motto when he was made a Cardinal: *cor ad cor loquitur*, 'heart speaks to heart.'

St. Thomas Aquinas would say this prayer before study: "Lord, you make eloquent the tongues of infants. Refine my speech and pour forth upon my lips the goodness of your blessing. Grant to me keenness of mind, capacity of remembering, skill in learning, subtlety in interpreting, and eloquence in speaking. May you guide the beginning of my work, direct its progress, and bring it to completion." In St. Thomas' case, this prayer was abundantly answered.

For those of us who are more modestly gifted, it is good to recall the words of St. Augustine: "Preach Christ wherever you can, to whom you can, and as you can. It is *faith* that is demanded of you, not *eloquence*. Let your faith speak for you, and then Christ will speak."
