



FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:

Beware of euphemisms.

It is reason alone that makes us men, and yet it is a rare thing to find men truly reasonable. — St. Francis de Sales

Language has the power to inform, to persuade and to motivate. That power can be used equally for good or for evil. It can be used to enlighten or to deceive. Too often, we find language used for the purpose of propaganda with little regard for honesty. The official newspaper in the Soviet Union was called *Pravda*, 'Truth.' The unabashed advocacy-journalism of our own mainstream media has more than earned our skepticism. It is truer than ever: "If you do not read the newspapers you are un-informed; if you do read them, you are mis-informed."

Language is properly used to *express* meaning, but it can also be used to *hide* meaning. One common misuse of language is the euphemism (from the Greek *eu* 'good' and *pheme* 'speaking'). So, instead of 'abortion' we have 'reproductive health'; instead of 'euthanasia' we have 'medical assistance in dying'; instead of 'gender ideology' we have 'diversity, equity, and inclusivity.' Here is the general rule: if you need a euphemism for what you are doing, then it is a good bet that what you are doing is evil.

I am a great admirer of Cardinal Newman. He is renowned as one of the great English writers of the Victorian era. As a prominent convert to the Catholic Church, he was involved in the religious controversies of his day. He loathed any kind of duplicity in language — what he called 'compromises and comprehensions.' He wrote, "I may think, as of course I do, that I am right and those who differ from me are wrong; but it does not mend matters for us to conceal our differences. It would be best if those differences did not exist — it is next best to confess them, plainly though in charity."

For Newman, it was always 'say what you mean, and mean what you say.' He wrote, "This is the great object to be aimed at in the present age: we need not dispute, we need not prove; we need to *define*. When men understand each other's *meaning*, they see, for the most part, that controversy is either superfluous or hopeless."

What motivated Newman was the ardent search for the truth. His goal was never to 'win the argument' but as St. Thomas Aquinas says, 'to learn the truth of how things stands.' For most men it is otherwise. As the Marquis of Halifax noted: "Nothing has an uglier look to us than reason, when it is not on our side." The guiding principle of our ruling elites is 'Never let the truth get in the way of a useful narrative.'

We have the tools for honestly expressing our principles and opinions, if that indeed is our goal. What is lacking is not the means, but the desire. If we cannot express in plain language what we are advocating, than we should recognize that we have a problem. If we need to hide behind *euphemisms*, then we are practicing deception.
