FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

O come, O come, Emmanuel.

Behold a virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel. — Isaiah 7:14

This passage in Isaiah has always been read by Christians as a prophecy of the miraculous conception of Jesus in the womb of the Blessed Virgin Mary. As a literalist youth, I noted that Mary did not in fact name her son 'Immanuel.' Isaiah, however, is saying something quite radical, because in Hebrew 'Immanu-El' literally means 'God with us.' This is a most apt title for Mary's son.

The name 'Jesus' is identical to 'Joshua' in the Old Testament. It was one of the more popular male names in first century Galilee. In Hebrew it is 'Yehoshua', which gets translated into Greek as 'Iesous', and then into English as 'Jesus.' Gabriel actually said to Mary, "You shall conceive in you womb and bear a son, and you shall call his name 'Yehoshua'," or in the common dialect, "Yeshua.'

There is Christian group that insists that we must only ever refer to Jesus as 'Yeshua' because, as St. Paul writes to the Philippians:,

God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name which is above every name, that at the name of <u>Jesus</u> every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

St. Paul uses the Greek form 'Iesous,' but in any case, that is *not* the name above every name. The supreme name is that which was told to Moses at the burning bush. Moses asks God: "If I come to the people of Israel and say to them, 'The God of your fathers has sent me to you,' and they ask me, 'What is his name?' what shall I say to them?" God replies: "YHWH, the God of your fathers, the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob has sent me to you."

God's proper name is 'YHWH' (Hebrew was written with only consonants) but that most holy name was never spoken out loud; instead, the word 'Adonai' (Lord) was substituted. This tradition continues in our English Bibles, where 'YHWH' appears as 'the LORD' using all capital letters. That is the name above all other names!

Moreover, St. Paul also cites the word of God in Isaiah: "Turn to me and be saved, all the ends of the earth! For I am God, and there is no other. ...To me every knee shall bow, every tongue shall swear." Paul is identifying Jesus with God of the Old Testament: 'Jesus Christ is LORD.'

As we draw near to the celebration of the birth of our Savior, we ponder in our hearts this fundamental truth of our faith. Jesus was not, as many seem to think, merely a good and wise and holy man, nor was he someone in whom the Spirit dwelt in a special way. Jesus is 'God from God, light from light, true God from true God.' Jesus said.,'If you have seen me you have seen the Father' — 'the Father and I are one' — 'I am in the Father and the Father is in me.' Jesus is *literally* 'Immanuel' — God with us.
