



FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

The totalitarian temptation

The root of modern totalitarianism is the denial of the transcendent dignity of the human person who, as the visible image of the invisible God, is therefore by his very nature the subject of rights which no one may violate — no individual, group, class, nation or State. Not even the majority of a social body may violate these rights. — Pope Leo XIII, cited by Pope John Paul II

Ryszard Legutko is a Polish philosopher and statesman. In his book, *The Demon in Democracy*, he writes about the 'totalitarian impulse in liberal democracies.' Reflecting on the situation in Poland after the fall of communism, he notes the ease with which former communists transformed into liberal democrats. He concludes that this transformation did not entail any real change in basic principles or ideology:

Both communism and liberal democracy are regimes whose intent is to change reality for the better. They are, to use the current jargon, modernization projects. Both systems strongly and impatiently intrude into the social fabric, and both justify their intrusion with the argument that it leads to the improvement of the state of affairs by 'modernizing' it.

In the current pandemic, our own governments have succumbed to the temptation to do 'whatever is necessary' to enforce 'public health measures', not short of suspending civil and religious rights. People have been fired from their jobs for being unvaxed and, as I write this, there is talk of a universal vaccination mandate as a response to 'omicron.'

What surprises me is how many people consider these actions good and reasonable—that it is appropriate and *necessary* to force people against their will 'to do the right thing.' The same people who justify coercion in the present circumstances will condemn the internment of Japanese-Canadians during the Second World War, the forced sterilization of the mentally unfit, and residential schools—although each of these government initiatives was seen at the time as providing an essential benefit to society. As we apologize for the mistakes of the past, maybe we ought to look at avoiding the mistakes of the present.

I have made it a point not to offer any opinion on the pandemic, but this goes far beyond the response to Covid. It concerns the whole raft of progressive causes now being imposed by government diktat: abortion, euthanasia, gender ideology, 'equity, diversity and inclusion.' All of these efforts to 'change reality for the better' are contrary to our fundamental Christian values.

The unshakable certainty of being right and having good intentions does not justify the violation of basic human rights. As Friedrich Hayek wrote, in 1944, reflecting on the rise of totalitarian regimes in Germany and Russia: "We shall never prevent the abuse of power if we are not prepared to limit power in a way which occasionally may also prevent its use for desirable purposes."
