

FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

St. Irenaeus: Bishop, Martyr and Doctor of the Church Faith is produced by the truth; for faith rests on things that truly are. — St. Irenaeus (On the Apostolic Preaching)

St. Irenaeus will soon be officially designated a 'Doctor of the Church' — 'doctor' is simply Latin for 'teacher.' He will be the 37th Saint so honored, joining in that honor with some of my other great Saints: Athanasius, Augustine, Bernard of Clairvaux, Thomas Aquinas, Catherine of Siena, Teresa of Avila, John of the Cross, and Francis de Sales.

Irenaeus is a witness to the faith of the early Church. Born around 130 A.D., he grew up in Asia Minor but later become Bishop of Lyons (in what is now France) and was martyred around 195 A.D. One of the things that makes St. Irenaeus special is his link to St. Polycarp. He writes:

While I was yet a boy, I knew blessed Polycarp and I still have a vivid recollection of what occurred at that time. He would speak of his familiar conversations with John [the Evangelist] and with the rest of those who had seen the Lord. Whatever things he had learned from them, both with regard to the Lord's miracles and his teaching, Polycarp would recount in harmony with the Scriptures. I listened to him attentively and treasured up his words, not on paper but in my heart, keeping all these things accurately in my mind.

Irenaeus wrote many books but only two have survived. The better known is his treatise Against the Heresies, which contains important passages expounding the Christian faith. The other book, On the Apostolic Preaching, was lost until a copy was discovered in an Armenian monastery in 1904.

The honor now given to Irenaeus is not for his benefit, but for ours. He is now designated a 'teacher of the Catholic faith.' If we simply honor him but fail to learn from him then Jesus' warning to the Pharisees applies to us: "Woe to you. For you build the tombs of the prophets and decorate their monuments." Prophets are sent, not to be honored, but to be listened to.

The great heresy of our day is what Pope Benedict called 'the hermeneutic of rupture.' This a lens through which the Second Vatican Council is seen as a point of rupture in the life of the Church. Thus, everything prior to the Council must be disparaged and discarded, even though Pope John XXIII explicitly stated that the Council was to teach 'nove sed non nova' — in a new way, but not new things.

At this time, rather than merely honor St. Irenaeus, it would profit us much more to listen to him:

The Church received the faith from the Apostles and now preserves it carefully. Having one soul and one heart, the Church holds this faith, preaches and teaches it consistently as though by a single voice. For though there are different languages, there is but one Tradition. Since our faith is everywhere and always the same, no one can either add to it or subtract from it.

To which I say, Amen.
