

FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Men, not angels, ministers of the Gospel.

For the utmost we have to do at first is to take care of our soul and to remember that in the entire world there is only God and the soul; and this is a thing which it is very profitable to remember. — St. Teresa of Avila

On a school chalkboard lets draw an organizational chart of the Church. It is a pyramidal structure. The wide base of the pyramid is all of the Catholic faithful, the ordinary pewsitters. Above them are the Pastors of the parishes to which they belong. Above the Pastors are the Bishops. Then, at the very top, over the Bishops, is the Pope.

Now where on this hierarchical chart should we put God? Above the Pope?

No! God is not anywhere *in* the chart — He is the chalkboard. Every person is equally near to God. Through Baptism, through prayer and the grace of the Sacraments, the Holy Trinity actually dwells within us. St. Augustine says: "God is closer to us than we are to ourselves."

Each of us has a direct relationship with God, and the role of the Church is to facilitate that relationship. The Church is not the collectivity of Christians. We do not 'make up' the Church. The Church exists apart from any individual Christian, because she is 'the mystical body of Christ.' The Church is not greater because I am in her; she would not be less if I were to leave her. The Church does not depend on me; I depend on the Church.

If you remember your Catechism, you know that the Church consists of three distinct groups of souls: the Church militant, the Church suffering, and the Church triumphant. The 'triumphant' are all the souls now in heaven; the 'suffering' are the holy souls in purgatory; the 'militant' are those of us still here on earth.

All those in the Church militant, whether they be the laity, those in religious life, or clergy, all are working out their salvation. We expect priests and bishops to be holy, or striving for holiness. We are scandalized when we see not only mediocrity but actual evil among the clergy. Their hypocrisy brings the entire Church into disrepute, and puts a huge stumbling block (Greek *skandalon*) in the way of those who are seeking Christ.

We must never let the faults of the clergy get in the way of our relationship with God. We should not give anyone such power over our souls. Indeed, we ought to hold those in ministry to a high standard — at the very least what Pope John Paul II called "the high standard of ordinary Christian living." But, as Cardinal Newman said: "It is men, not angels, who are ministers of the Gospel." We should not allow their failings to diminish our love of the Church.

St. Augustine preached to his congregation fifteen centuries ago: "We receive the Holy Spirit if we love the Church, if we rejoice in the Catholic name and hold the Catholic faith. As much as we love Church of Christ, in the same measure we have the Holy Spirit."

PARISH UPDATE:

FR. GLASS is leaving the parish to help care for his mother in Ottawa. His last day here will be February 14th. Fr. Glass came to Alliston as a Seminarian in August 2005 and then as Pastor in September 2011. The Archdiocese will assign an Administrator to carry on the pastoral ministry. We hope to provide further details in the next bulletin.

FR. BENNETT had a fall in the middle of January, shortly before his 96th birthday. He has been in hospital since then but will soon be moving to Simcoe Manor in Beeton. He remains in good spirits. Please keep him in your prayers.
