

From the desk of Father Norberto

Dear Parish Family,

As we continue our journey through the Lenten season, our hearts are drawn deeper into the mystery of Christ's sacrifice and the promise of resurrection. This fifth Sunday of Lent marks a pivotal moment in our spiritual pilgrimage, inviting us to reflect on the transformative power of God's love as revealed in John 12:24: "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains alone; but if it dies, it bears much fruit."

These profound words of Jesus challenge us to consider the paradoxical nature of transformation – that new life often emerges from moments of surrender, sacrifice, and even apparent loss. The imagery of a grain of wheat falling into the earth and dying speaks to the mysterious process by which God brings forth life from death, beauty from brokenness, and hope from despair.

As we contemplate this passage, we are confronted with the reality of our own spiritual journey. Like the grain of wheat, each of us is called to undergo a process of dying to self – to our own desires, ambitions, and agendas – in order to experience the abundant life that Christ promises us. This season of Lent serves as a sacred invitation to embrace this process of transformation, to allow God to till the soil of our hearts and cultivate within us a harvest of righteousness and love.

In the midst of our Lenten observances – our fasting, prayer, and almsgiving – it can be tempting to view these disciplines as mere obligations or rituals. Yet, the deeper invitation of Lent is to enter into a living relationship with the God who desires to renew and transform us from within. It is a time to surrender our will to God's will, to open ourselves to the power of His grace, and to allow His Spirit to lead us on the path of discipleship.

As we approach the fifth Sunday of Lent, we are reminded that the journey of faith is not always easy or comfortable. There are seasons of pruning and purification, moments of struggle and doubt, when we are called to let go of our attachments and entrust ourselves more fully to God's providential care. Yet, it is precisely in these moments of surrender that we experience the transformative power of God's love working in and through us.

The story of Jesus' passion and death is the ultimate testament to this truth. Through His obedience to the Father's will, even unto death on a cross, Jesus reveals the depth of God's love for humanity and the redemptive power of His sacrifice. Just as the grain of wheat must fall into the earth and die in order to bear fruit, so too must Jesus undergo His own death and resurrection in order to bring forth the fruits of salvation for all.

As we meditate on the words of Jesus, let us consider the areas of our lives that are in need of transformation. What old habits, attitudes, or patterns of behavior do we need to let go of in order to make room for the new life that God desires to cultivate within us? What areas of our hearts remain closed off to God's grace, in need of His healing touch and transformative power?

May this Lenten season be a time of deep spiritual renewal and growth for each of us, as we allow ourselves to be planted in the fertile soil of God's love and grace. Let us embrace the process of transformation with open hearts and willing spirits, trusting that God is always at work, bringing forth new life from the seeds of our surrender.


