

From the desk of Father Norberto

Beloved Parish Family,

As we gather together in spirit on this sacred Feast of Divine Mercy Sunday, I am humbled to know that while you read these words, I am kneeling in prayer at the National Shrine of the Divine Mercy in Stockbridge, Massachusetts, offering supplication and intercession for each and every one of you and for our entire parish community. Though physically separated by distance, our hearts are united in worship and devotion before our merciful Lord.

The Feast of Divine Mercy serves as a profound reminder of the incomprehensible depth of God's love and mercy for each one of us. It is a day set apart to reflect upon the immeasurable sacrifice of Jesus Christ, who, out of His boundless love, endured the agony of the cross to redeem us from sin and death. It is a day to rejoice in the unfathomable mercy that flows from His Sacred Heart, offering forgiveness and redemption to all who seek it with contrite hearts.

Let us be mindful of those around us who are in need of forgiveness, understanding, and love. May we extend the same mercy that we have received from our Heavenly Father to others, seeking reconciliation and peace in our relationships.

As I offer my prayers at the shrine, I lift up each and every one of you to the merciful heart of Jesus. May His love surround you, His mercy embrace you, and His peace dwell within you always.

Together, let us give thanks to God for the gift of Divine Mercy, which knows no bounds and endures forever. May we continue to draw strength and consolation from His mercy, knowing that we are never alone on our journey of faith.


Muffin Sunday
