

Registration is open for First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion for the **2024-25 school year**. Parents may register their child entering Grade 2 or older at the following link, which is also be posted to the church website. The deadline for registration is **Wednesday September 11**, **2024**. The registration fee of **\$50** per family and the child's baptismal certificate can be sealed in an envelope and handed to Fr. Norberto after weekend masses throughout the summer or brought to the first parent meeting.
