

From the Desk of Father Norberto

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On this First Sunday of Advent, we embark on a sacred journey - a journey of hope, renewal, and joyful expectations. Advent is a season that invites us to prepare our hearts to celebrate the coming of Christ - His birth in Bethlehem, His presence in our daily lives, and His return in glory. It is a time to rekindle hope in the promises of God, knowing that His love is steadfast, and His word is true.

As we step into 2025, the Church invites us to reflect deeply on the theme of this new Jubilee year: Pilgrims of Hope. What a beautiful reminder this is of our identity as Christians! To be a pilgrim is to journey with purpose, trusting in the destination even when the path is uncertain. To be a pilgrim of hope is to journey through life with confidence in God's promises, bringing light to a world often overshadowed by fear and doubt.

Hope is the central theme of this first week of Advent. It is not a vague wish or a fleeting feeling. Rather, hope is a profound trust in God's faithfulness. It is the assurance that, even in the darkest moments, God's light shines, and His love prevails. Hope does not deny the challenges we face but sees beyond them to the greater reality of God's plan for our salvation.

On this first Sunday of Advent, Jesus calls us to vigilance: "Be watchful! Be alert! You do not know when the time will come" - (Mark 13:33). These words remind us that Advent is not only about waiting but about preparing. We are called to be attentive to God's presence in our lives and to live in joyful anticipation of His coming. This watchfulness is not a passive state; it is an active commitment to live as people of hope, trusting that Christ is with us every step of the way.

As Pilgrims of Hope, we are invited to bring the light of Christ into a world longing for meaning and peace. This mission is more urgent than ever. Many in our communities feel weighed down by loneliness, division, and uncertainty. Yet, Advent reminds us that we are not alone. The God who came to dwell among us in Bethlehem continues to walk with us, guiding us with His love and mercy.

The prophet Isaiah's words resonate deeply in this season: "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light"- (Isaiah 9:2). This light is Jesus Christ, the fulfillment of God's promises. As we light the first candle on the Advent wreath, let it be a symbol of the hope that shines in our hearts - a hope that cannot be extinguished, for it is rooted in God's unchanging love.

This Advent, I encourage you to embrace your identity as Pilgrims of Hope. Let us journey together, trusting that God is leading us, even when the way is unclear. Let us also bring hope to others through small acts of kindness and compassion. Perhaps it is a phone call to someone who feels forgotten, a word of encouragement to a friend in need, or simply a moment of prayer for those who are struggling. In these simple gestures, we reflect the love of Christ and bear witness to the hope we carry.

As we begin this Advent season and this Jubilee year dedicated to Pilgrims of Hope, let us keep our eyes fixed on Jesus, the source and fulfillment of all hope. Let us prepare our hearts to welcome Him with joy, knowing that He comes to bring peace to a troubled world and light to our darkest moments.

May this Advent be a time of renewal for you and your loved ones. May the hope of Christ fill your hearts, strengthen your faith, and guide your journey as Pilgrims of Hope.
