

From the desk of Father Norberto: -

Dear Parishioners,

"Rejoice in the Lord always; again, I say, rejoice. Indeed, the Lord is near" - Philippians 4:4-5.

The Third Sunday of Advent is traditionally called Gaudete Sunday, a day of rejoicing as we draw closer to the birth of our Savior, Jesus Christ. The word Gaudete comes from the Latin for "Rejoice."

This theme of joy is reflected in the rose-colored candle we light on our Advent wreath and the rose vestments the priest wears at Mass. It serves as a reminder that the season of waiting, and preparation is nearing its fulfillment in the joyous celebration of Christmas.

As Christians, our joy does not depend on fleeting circumstances or worldly success. True joy comes from knowing that God is with us, that His promises are trustworthy, and that He never abandons us. *The prophet Isaiah tells us: "Be strong, do not fear! Here is your God" - (Isaiah 35:4)*. This assurance of God's presence fills us with hope, even amid challenges. This Advent joy reminds us that our waiting is not in vain. God is faithful, and the fulfillment of His promise in the coming of Christ gives us reason to rejoice, not only at Christmas but every day of our lives.

This year, the universal Church invites us to embark on a Jubilee Year of Pilgrim of Hope as we prepare for the Holy Year in 2025. This theme aligns beautifully with Gaudete Sunday, for hope and joy are inseparable. A pilgrim is someone on a journey, moving forward in trust, faith, and expectation of what lies ahead. As we reflect on this Jubilee theme, we are reminded that joy sustains us on the pilgrimage of life.

Just as Advent is a journey of preparation for the coming of Christ, our lives are a spiritual pilgrimage toward eternal communion with God. Along the way, we encounter trials, uncertainties, and waiting. But Gaudete Sunday teaches us to embrace joy on the journey, knowing that God's presence accompanies us at every step. Our hope in God's promises strengthens us, and our joy in Him sustains us, even when the road seems long or difficult.

This Jubilee Year also calls us to share the joy of the Gospel with others. Pope Francis often speaks of the importance of joyful Christians, saying, "A Christian is never sad. Never give way to discouragement!" When we live with authentic joy, rooted in Christ, we become witnesses to the world of God's goodness and love. We share this joy during Advent by offering kindness and support to those who are struggling, by participating in works of charity within our parish and community, by taking time to reflect on God's blessings in our lives and sharing gratitude with others, and by inviting those who feel distant from the Church to experience the joy of God's mercy and love.

As we light the rose candle this Sunday, may it remind us that the light of Christ is near and that His joy is for everyone. Let us embrace the call of this Jubilee Year to be pilgrims of hope, walking with joy and faith toward the fullness of God's promises.

May the joy of the Lord fill your hearts and homes this Advent season.
