

From the desk of Father Norberto

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As we gather on this final Sunday of Advent, we find ourselves on the threshold of Christmas. The anticipation of Christ's birth fills our hearts with joy and wonder. The Advent wreath's final candle, the candle of peace, reminds us of the profound gift Christ brings to the world: the peace that surpasses all understanding.

This year, as we prepare to celebrate Christmas, we do so in the light of the Church's Jubilee Year, which invites us to embark on a "*Pilgrim of Hope*." The Jubilee theme calls us to reflect on the journey of our faith, the hope we carry in our hearts, and the ways we can become bearers of Christ's peace in a world longing for healing and reconciliation.

Our readings on this Sunday guide us to the heart of God's promise of peace. The prophecy of Isaiah tells of Emmanuel, "God with us," who will dwell among His people. In the Gospel, we hear of Mary, the humble servant of the Lord, whose "yes" to God brings the Prince of Peace into the world. Mary's willingness to trust in God's plan transforms her into the first "pilgrim of hope," carrying Jesus in her womb and journeying in faith.

The peace of Christmas is not just a fleeting sentiment or an absence of conflict. It is a deep, abiding peace that flows from knowing we are loved by God, redeemed by His Son, and sustained by the Holy Spirit. This peace begins in our hearts but is meant to radiate outward - to our families, communities, and the world.

The Jubilee Year theme, Pilgrim of Hope, reminds us that we are all on a journey, individually and as a Church. Like Mary and Joseph, who traveled to Bethlehem, we are called to move forward in faith, trusting in God's providence and seeking His will for our lives.

To be a pilgrim is to embrace a spirit of openness, humility, and trust. It is to recognize that our ultimate destination is not found in earthly achievements or material possessions but in union with God. As pilgrims of hope, we carry the light of Christ into a world that often seems overshadowed by darkness. Hope and peace go hand in hand. Hope keeps us anchored in the promises of God, even in the face of uncertainty or suffering. It is this hope that allows us to become instruments of peace, fostering reconciliation in our relationships, our communities, and even across nations.

As we reflect on the theme of peace, we cannot ignore the many places in our world where peace feels distant. We think especially of the people of Ukraine, the Middle East, and other regions affected by war, conflict, and division. The celebration of Christmas calls us to pray fervently for peace in these troubled areas and to work for justice and understanding wherever we can. As pilgrims of hope, we are also called to examine our own hearts. True peace begins within, in a heart reconciled to God and aligned with His will.

As we prepare to celebrate the birth of Christ, let us remember that Christmas is the ultimate affirmation of God's faithfulness to His promises. In Jesus, God enters our world in the most humble and vulnerable way, as a newborn child. He comes not as a distant ruler but as Emmanuel, "God with us," walking alongside us in our joys and struggles.

The Christmas story is filled with journeys: Mary and Joseph traveling to Bethlehem, the shepherds seeking the newborn King, the Magi following the star. Each of these journeys is marked by hope, faith, and the discovery of God's peace. This Christmas, let us consider how we, too, are called to embark on a spiritual journey - to seek Christ more deeply, to trust Him more fully, and to share His love more generously.

As we light the candle of peace and prepare to celebrate Christmas, I encourage each of you to take a moment to reflect on how you can be a pilgrim of hope and a bearer of peace in the coming year. Perhaps it is through prayer, deepening your relationship with God. Perhaps it is through acts of service, reaching out to those who are lonely, struggling, or in need. Or perhaps it is through reconciliation, healing a strained relationship in your life.

Let us remember that peace is a gift from God, but it is also a task entrusted to us. The angels who announced Christ's birth proclaimed, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of goodwill." Let us strive to be those people of goodwill, bringing glory to God through our lives and sharing His peace with the world.

Wishing you all a blessed Advent, a joyful Christmas, and a New Year filled with peace and hope.
