

From the desk of Father Norberto

Dear Parish Family,

On this Second Sunday of Lent, we journey with Jesus and His closest disciples—Peter, James, and John—to the mountaintop, where He is transfigured before them. His face shines like the sun, and His clothes become dazzling white. Moses and Elijah appear, and the voice of the Father declares, "*This is my beloved Son; listen to Him.*"

The Transfiguration is one of the most profound moments in Jesus' earthly ministry. It offers a glimpse of His divine glory, reinforcing that His path to suffering and death will ultimately lead to resurrection and triumph. It is also an invitation to reflect on our own transfiguration - our own journey of transformation in Christ.

The Call to Transformation

Lent is a season of conversion, a time when we are called to be changed, renewed, and transfigured by God's grace. Just as Jesus was revealed in His glory on the mountain, so too are we called to reveal God's presence in our lives. But transformation is not always easy. Like Peter, James, and John, we may be tempted to remain in moments of spiritual comfort, wishing to build tents and stay on the mountaintop. However, true transfiguration happens when we descend from the mountain and live out our faith in the valleys of daily life.

What does this transformation look like? It is the daily work of turning away from sin and embracing holiness. It is allowing God to change our hearts, heal our wounds, and make us new. It is choosing love over indifference, mercy over judgment, and faith over fear.

Listening to Jesus

The Father's words from the cloud - "Listen to Him" are central to our Lenten journey. Transformation begins when we truly listen to Jesus, not just with our ears but with our hearts. He speaks to us in Scripture, in prayer, and in the needs of those around us. Lent is a time to quiet the distractions of the world so we can hear His voice more clearly.

How are we listening to Jesus this Lent? Are we making time for prayer? Are we opening our hearts to His guidance? Are we allowing His Word to shape our thoughts and actions? True transfiguration happens when we surrender to His voice and allow His grace to work in us.

Pilgrims of Hope: Preparing for the Jubilee

As we reflect on the Transfiguration, we also look ahead to the Jubilee Year 2025, a time when the Church invites us to be *"Pilgrims of Hope."* This theme connects beautifully to Jesus' Transfiguration. It was a moment of hope for the disciples. It reassured them that, despite the suffering and trials that lay ahead, Jesus was indeed the glorious Son of God.

In our own lives, we, too, need moments of transfiguration - glimpses of God's presence that strengthen us in difficult times. Lent can be challenging, but it is a journey toward Easter joy. Our sacrifices, prayers, and acts of charity are not ends in themselves but steps toward a greater hope - the hope of resurrection, the hope of new life in Christ.

As pilgrims of hope, we are called to carry this light of Christ into the world. Just as Jesus' face shone brightly on the mountain, we are called to reflect His light in our families, our workplaces, and our communities. We do this by acts of love, by living our faith with joy, and by being witnesses of God's mercy.
