From the desk of Father Norberto

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As we journey through this Lenten season, we are reminded that Lent is not just a time of sacrifice but also a time of grace, renewal, and return. This Sunday, the Gospel presents to us the Parable of the Prodigal Son, a powerful story of repentance, mercy, and homecoming.

The prodigal son's journey is one that mirrors our own spiritual pilgrimage. He asked for his inheritance, left home, and wasted everything in reckless living. It was only when he found himself lost, hungry, and broken that he recognized his need for his father's love. In humility, he made the decision to return, saying, *"Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you; I no longer deserve to be called your son."*

This moment of realization was not just about regret. It was about hope. The son believed that even after all he had done, there was still a place for him in his father's house. And indeed, as soon as he took that first step home, his father ran to meet him, embraced him, and restored him, not as a servant, but as a beloved son.

We, too, are like the prodigal son. So often, we stray from God's love, seeking fulfillment in things that do not satisfy. We waste the gifts He has given us, choosing paths that lead us away from Him. But no matter how far we have gone, the Father is always waiting. The journey of the prodigal son is a reminder that conversion is possible, that grace is available, and that hope is never lost.

Our Pilgrimage of Hope

As we prepare for the Jubilee, the Church calls us to embark on a Pilgrimage of Hope. What does this mean for us? It means that, like the prodigal son, we are invited to return to the Father, not in fear, but in trust. The road back may not always be easy. We may feel unworthy, ashamed, or uncertain but the Father's arms are always open.

A pilgrimage is not just about movement; it is about transformation. The prodigal son left home in pride but returned in humility. He left seeking independence but returned, realizing his need for the Father. Our Lenten journey and our preparation for the Jubilee should reflect this same movement of the heart - a turning away from sin and a turning toward God, full of hope that He will receive us with mercy.

The prodigal son did not know how his father would react, but he still chose to return. This is the essence of hope - trusting in God's love even when we do not fully understand it. In this Jubilee, we are called to deepen that hope, to believe that no matter how broken our world may seem, no matter how lost we may feel, God is still calling us home.

Let us walk this journey together, supporting one another as fellow pilgrims. Let us encourage those who feel distant from the Church to return, not with judgment, but with the same joy that filled the father when he saw his son coming home.

As we continue in this Lenten season, may we take inspiration from the prodigal son and embrace the grace of conversion. May our pilgrimage of hope lead us back to the heart of the Father, where we will always find mercy, love, and joy.

But living with a mental illness, he struggled more than some. Deep inside, he felt like something was missing, and he devastatingly fell into addiction. "By the grace of God, I am still alive," he proclaims. "I'd love to be able to give back what was so freely given to me. I am taking roles of service, giving back as much as I can. I was afraid I'd never be able to feel the way I feel. I am very grateful that I have been given this opportunity to be sober." Thanks to your support, he is no longer just surviving—he is thriving, with a heart full of hope and a future filled with promise.


The Stations of the Cross
