

From the desk of Father Norberto

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Today, we begin the most sacred and solemn week of our liturgical year - Holy Week. With the waving of palms and the cries of "Hosanna," we enter into Palm Sunday, also known as Passion Sunday. It is a day of great contrast: joyful acclamations at Jesus' entry into Jerusalem soon turn to somber silence as we listen to the narrative of His suffering and death.

This year, we reflect on these mysteries in a special light - as pilgrims of hope, journeying toward the Jubilee Year 2025. Pope Francis has invited the whole Church to enter this time as a pilgrimage: walking with faith, grounded in hope, and renewed in love. And Holy Week is the better moment to embrace this journey.

Holy Week is, in itself, a pilgrimage. Each day moves us closer to the heart of our faith. We are not mere spectators of ancient events, but participants in the mystery of our salvation. From the Upper Room to Calvary, from the Cross to the empty tomb, we walk with Jesus. We are not alone. We walk together as a Church, as a community of faith, as pilgrims of hope.

Hope may seem difficult to hold on to when we are confronted with the suffering and injustice of the Passion. But our hope is not naïve optimism. It is a hope rooted in the Cross where love defeats sin, where mercy overcomes evil, and where life ultimately triumphs over death. Jesus enters fully into human suffering so that He may redeem it from within. As pilgrims of hope, we carry this truth with us and offer it to a world in desperate need of healing.

As we wave our palms today, we remember that they are not just symbols of victory but signs of commitment. Will we walk with Christ not only in moments of joy but also in His Passion? Will we stand by Him when He is rejected, betrayed, and crucified in our world today—in the poor, the sick, the suffering, the lonely, and the oppressed?

The Jubilee reminds us that the Church is always on the move, always on pilgrimage. But it is not a journey of escape - it is a journey of transformation. Holy Week is our chance to be transformed again by God's love. It is our time to repent, to renew, and to recommit ourselves to the Gospel.

Let us walk this Holy Week with open hearts. Let us enter the Upper Room on Holy Thursday and learn again what it means to serve. Let us stand at the foot of the Cross on Good Friday and rediscover the depth of God's love. Let us keep vigil in silence and anticipation on Holy Saturday. And then, with all creation, let us rejoice in the light and life of Easter morning.

As your pastor, I pray that this Holy Week will be a sacred time of grace for you and your family. May it be a true pilgrimage - one that moves your heart, deepens your faith, and renews your hope. And as we look forward to the Jubilee Year 2025, may we continue walking together, as joyful pilgrims of hope, bearing witness to the power of the Cross and the promise of the Resurrection.
