

From the desk of Father Norberto Eyule

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

This Sunday is a truly momentous day for our parish. Not only do we celebrate the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, but we also joyfully launch our year-long celebration of the 150th Anniversary of St. Paul Parish. What a beautiful providence that these two celebrations fall on the same day! For it is the Eucharist - the living presence of Jesus Christ in our midst - that has sustained our parish for the past 150 years. And it is the Eucharist that continues to guide us forward as we walk in faith with Christ.

On this solemnity of Corpus Christi, we proclaim a central mystery of our faith: that Jesus Christ is truly present - Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity - in the Eucharist. The Eucharist is not a symbol or a memory, but a living encounter with the Risen Lord who gives Himself to us, again and again, out of sheer love. When Jesus said, "*This is my Body... this is my Blood*," He wasn't just giving us a ritual. He was giving us Himself - a gift that nourishes our souls, binds us together as a community, and sends us out to be His presence in the world. The Eucharist is the heart of the Church, and for 150 years, it has been the heart of our parish.

As we begin our celebration of the 150th Anniversary of St. Paul Parish, we look back with deep gratitude. Our theme, "Walking in Faith with Christ," is more than a slogan. It is the lived experience of generations of faithful Catholics who built this parish with love, sacrifice, and unwavering trust in God. Our spiritual ancestors - many of them immigrants and pioneers - carried with them a deep devotion to the Eucharist. Through times of hardship, war, economic depression, social change, and even a global pandemic, they came to this sacred space to pray, to worship, and most of all, to receive Jesus in the Eucharist.

They may not have had much, but they had faith. And that faith was nourished by the Mass, strengthened by the sacraments, and lived out in community. For 150 years, St. Paul Parish has been a beacon of faith, hope, and love. Thousands have been baptized at this font, forgiven at this confessional, confirmed by the Holy Spirit, united in marriage, and sent forth from this altar to love and serve the Lord.

As we mark this milestone, we are not simply looking back, we are also looking forward. Our 150th anniversary is not just a time to remember the past, but to renew our commitment to the future. What kind of parish will we be in the years ahead? Will we continue to place the Eucharist at the center of our lives? Will we raise up new generations who hunger for the Bread of Life? Will we be a community that walks in faith with Christ - not only in church but in the streets, the schools, the workplaces, and the homes of our community? The Eucharist is our food for the journey, and our journey is not yet done.

This year-long celebration invites us to reconnect with our roots, to celebrate our Catholic identity, and to renew our mission as disciples of Jesus. There will be many moments of joy - special liturgies, parish events, opportunities to tell our stories and to thank those who have come before us. But most of all, this year is an invitation to deepen our faith. Let us walk with Christ more intentionally - through prayer, service, reconciliation, and a renewed love for the Eucharist.

I would like to take this moment to thank each of you for being part of this journey. Whether you are a lifelong parishioner or newly arrived, you are part of a sacred story that began 150 years ago and continues to unfold in grace. As we walk together in faith with Christ, let us draw strength from the same source that nourished our founders: the Eucharist. May the Body and Blood of Christ, truly present in our midst, make us one body, one spirit in Christ. And may our patron, St. Paul, inspire us to proclaim with courage and joy: "It is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me."

Happy Corpus Christi Sunday, and happy 150th Anniversary to us all!
