Toronto Diocesan Council 104th Annual Convention

Loretta Gismondi and Dawn Westcott represented our council at the convention on April 28-29, 2025, at the Ajax Convention Centre. On the Sunday night, Loretta and Dawn ironed 15 albs for the priests attending mass on Monday. Then we assisted in setting up the prayer room with Diane Hunter and Susan May from our Northern Region. We were finished at 10:00 that night! All attendees at the convention were welcome to visit the prayer room over the two convention days.

On Monday the first day started with the opening Eucharistic Celebration celebrated by Bishop Vincent Nguyen. Loretta and I also met Father Edwin from Holy Martyr's of Japan Church in Bradford. 270 CWL members attended the mass with a procession of 12 priests. We also spoke to Deacon David Quail who we see every year at the convention. His mother, Connie Quail, was one of our founding CWL members.

After a coffee/tea break the business session was comprised of the Land Acknowledgement, League Prayer, Opening Prayer, Welcome from Toronto Diocesan President Kate O'Quinn, introduction of the Toronto Diocesan Spiritual Director Father Liborio and the Crowning of Mary by Mary Capobianco, CWL Life Member. The morning session commenced with the reading of the Standing Rules of the 104th Annual Diocesan Convention before any voting took place throughout the two days.

After a lunch break, CWL members reconvened and then met for an hour for the Resolution Dialogue at the various table groupings with a moderator at each table. Feedback was recorded and given to the Resolutions Chair, Christina Boyle, in preparation for the voting on the second day.

Committee reports were given and can be found on the website: <u>www.cwltoronto.ca</u>. A Deceased Members' Prayer Service took place with the executive members each carrying a single red rose, while Father Liborio carried a single white rose for Pope Francis. Mary Capobianco, Life Member, crowned the statue of Mary.

After supper the youth awards were presented. The Keynote speaker was Father Tim Hanley who spoke on the "<u>Pilgrims of Hope</u>" which he eagerly supports in the Jubilee Year 2025. He told us that every 25-50 years the Catholic Church celebrates a Jubilee Year, which is different from an ordinary year. There are open doors and places of pilgrimage and indulgences can be gained, thus Father said he sees signs of hope in our world, and it is gradually changing. We should end our pilgrimage with Reconciliation and Confession if possible. We ended the evening by reciting the Jubilee Prayer. Then Loretta and I were dancing with our sisters to the disc jockey D J. TeeCee's music. Later, we dropped in for a while to visit with our Northern CWL sisters.

On Tuesday several awards were presented. The Patricia Beattie Mentoring Award went to Diana Gamboa, Alice Warford won the Auxiliary Mentor Award. TDC 2025.01 <u>Resolution</u>- Federal Government to create a Unified Cybercrime Reporting System for All Canadians- **Passed**

TD 2025.02 <u>**Resolution**</u> -The Federal Government to Follow Through with Formation of a Health Canada Office of Palliative Care- **Passed**

The two Resolutions will now be presented at the upcoming CWL Provincial Convention in July in London, Ontario.

It is well worth attending a convention as a lot of learning takes place about the League and over the years we meet old friends and make new friendships.
