

# Archdiocese Jubilee Pilgrimage to Martyr's Shrine

Loretta Gismondi organized a bus trip for the <u>Jubilee Year-Pilgrims of Hope</u> on Sunday, August 24<sup>th</sup>. Eleven passengers enjoyed a beautiful, peaceful, faith-filled inspiring day! There were many buses and cars at the Shrine as close to 4,000 people were in attendance. Throughout the day, dozens of priests heard confessions with hundreds of pilgrims lining up to experience the powerful sacrament of reconciliation. The afternoon included a Rosary Procession throughout the Shrine grounds followed by Eucharistic Adoration and Benediction by His Eminence Francis Cardinal Leo, Metropolitan Archbishop of Toronto. It was most satisfying to see 19 clergy from the different areas of Toronto and beyond. Our bus driver, Mark, made our day extra-special with his kindness.
